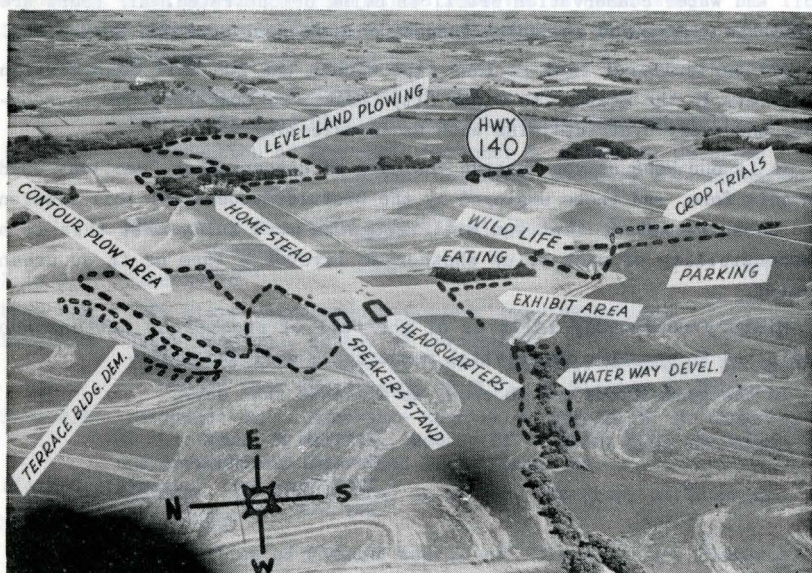

WELCOME TO 1959 SOIL CONSERVATION FIELD DAY AND PLOWING MATCHES

You are now in the Little Sioux Watershed District. This is one of eleven Pilot Watersheds established in the United States by Congress in 1946. The Little Sioux Watershed, of 4500 square miles, primarily covers eight districts - O'Brien, Plymouth, Cherokee, Buena Vista, Woodbury, Ida, Sac, and Monona. Within these districts there are now 150 organized sub-watersheds.

You are in the Arrowhead Sub-Watershed which was completed in 1959. Wagon-Taxis are available to take you through the Little Egypt Sub-Watershed now under construction. The tour will also give you a view of several soil and water conservation practices being demonstrated. Air tours are available to give you an aerial inspection of several more Sub-Watersheds.

All agricultural land in Iowa lies within the 100 Soil Conservation Districts in the State. The Sioux City Chamber of Commerce, our co-sponsor, and every district joins with us in welcoming you.

It is our hope as you observe the type of Conservation Practices used on this farm, and those employed by the District to control soil erosion and conserve water, that you will recognize more fully that this is a responsibility of each of us whether we live on a farm or in an urban center.

History repeatedly tells us of the fall of prosperous nations who neglected to conserve those vital resources - soil and water.

To the generations yet to come, we dedicate this day.
