

Tech. Sgt. Ronald Rowe, son of E. N. Rowe of Beaman returned last week after receiving his discharge from the army by the point system at Camp Sibert, on Oct. 5, 1945. He enlisted in the army Feb. 6th, 1941, and was in Co. H, 168th Infantry of Marshalltown. He received his training at Camp Claiborne, La., and was sent to Fort Dix, N. J., prior to going overseas in April, 1942. He volunteered to join the 1st Ranger Bn. in July at Camp Killo-dees, Ireland, and took his training in Scotland with the British Commandos. He went from Scotland to Africa, where the Rangers made the initial landing on Nov. 8, 1942. He served in the Algeria-French-Morocco and Tunisian campaigns. He returned to the states in November, 1943, and after spending a month's furlough with relatives in Beaman, he was stationed at Camp Wheeler, Ga., where he has been until receiving his discharge. Before entering the service he was employed as clerk in the Thomas Store at Beaman. He is staying at the home of his sister and brother-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Laurence Zink, where he intends to make his home for the present.

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
