Statement by the State
Soil Conservation
Committee

Conservation District

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

Be it known that on the 12th day of April, 1944, a petition for the organization of the Monroe County Soil Conservation District, signed by 25 or more landowners who represent 20% or more of the owners of lands lying within the limits of the territory proposed to be organized into a soil conservation district, was duly filed in the office of the State Soil Conservation Committee.

That on the 26th day of April, 1944, at the Commercial Club Room, Albia, Iowa, public hearing was held after due notice of the said hearing had been given as required by law:

That on the 26th day of April, 1944, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that there is need in the interest of the health, safety and public welfare, for a soil conservation district to function in the proposed territory and did define the boundaries thereof;

That thereafter due notice was given of a referendum of the question of the creation of the said district, and an election of commissioners to be held within the territory so defined by the Committee;

That the said referendum and election of commissioners was held within the said defined boundaries on the 13th day of May, 1944:

That the result of the said referendum showed that 97% of the votes cast in the said referendum were in favor of the creation of the said district.

That thereafter on the 17th day of May, 1944, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that the operation of the said district is administratively practicable and feasible;

That the boundaries of the said district were defined by the State Soil Conservation Committee as follows:

All land lying within the boundaries of Monroe County, Iowa exclusive of incorporated cities and towns.

In witness whereof the State Soil Conservation Committee has caused these presents to be executed by its secretary under the seal of the Committee, this 24th day of May, 1944.

Now therefore, it is hereby certified that the Monroe County Soil Conservation District has been duly organized as a governmental subdivision of this State and a public body corporate and politic.
