

Alfred Stewart To Attend National SCD Convention In Portland, Oregon

OLWEN — Alfred Stewart, who near the end of October, January, commences, "I farm in my spare time" when he lists his activities.

Stewart is the president of the Iowa Association of Soil Conservation District Commissioners. He was elected to the post last September, a one-year term.

He also is a district commissioner in Fayette county, a commodity ABC committee, township clerk, serves on the Board of Pardon, Merit and is in the Workshop of the National Labor Union.

Stewart has farmed near Olwens for 30 years. He's served as district commissioner for 15 years in Fayette county.

Stewart is a visiting delegate for Iowa in the National Association of Soil Conservation District Commissioners. He will travel by train to Portland, Ore., for the annual session, Feb. 11.

His wife Florence, who will also make the trip to Portland, is the area vice-president of the Ladies Auxiliary of the National Association of Soil Conservation District Commissioners.

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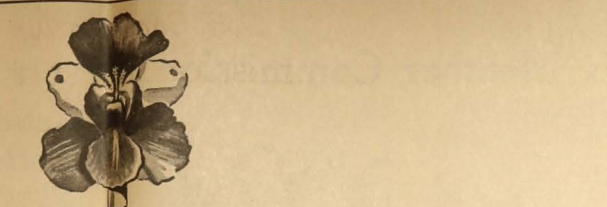

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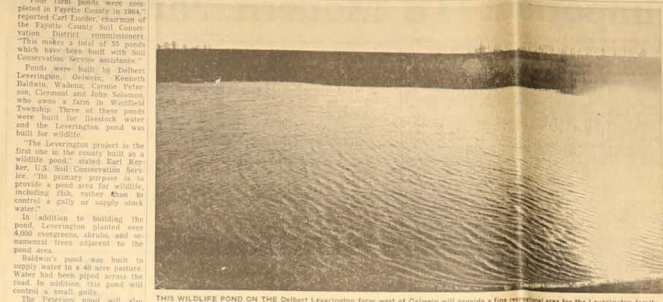

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Fayette County Conservation Board Acquires Five Separate Park Areas

In addition to the two State Parks, the Fayette County Conservation Board, one of two soil conservation districts in the state, has acquired five separate park areas for park purposes located in the north and west half of the county.

The total area involved is approximately 174.6 acres, comprising 100 from 4.6 acres to 62.6 acres. Acquisitions by deed of 110.1 acres and 8.47 acres on June 15, 1970. Development of Lake Brulee Park, 62.6 acres, is under way. 87.39 acres total, is about completed. The Dillon Lake Park, 100 acres, is under development. Since 1965, about 100 completed. Drowning Park, 3.6 miles southeast of Weaverville, is undeveloped. Some clearing, planting, and construction is being planned for 1972 for the latter.

Complete development of the parks will include power facilities, tables and benches, children's playground equipment, latrines, water, electrical service, parking, etc. or, house, roads, parking areas, trails, etc.

The acquisition and development of the five separate parks will be of increased benefit to many conservation areas in that the increased acreage of soil conservation practice will decrease soil fertility loss, reduce erosion, runoff, silt, and flood damage.

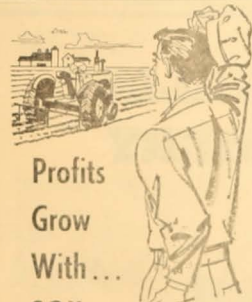
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
