

Louisa County soil survey report now available

A long-awaited "Soil Survey Report" that began with the first mapping of all of the Louisa County Soils in 1979, is now available for distribution.

The report, which contains information valuable to farmers, land developers, engineers and a variety of individuals involved with land use in Louisa County, will be distributed throughout the county at five locations on July 6-7, according to Don Behning, County Extension Agriculturist.

Free copies of the survey will be distributed to farmers, landowners, and other agribusiness persons attending any of the five informational meetings on July 6th and 7th.

Each meeting is open to the public and will feature information on how the survey was made, conservation uses, agricultural uses for crop production including the corn suitability rating of each soil mapping unit, along with a complete explanation on how to use the report. All persons in attendance at the soil survey distribution will be able to identify soil mapping units on their farms and learn about characteristics of each soil type.
