Miss Dorothy West Is Wed At Fort Collins, Col. Sept. 5

An early pretty fall wedding occurred on Saturday, Sept. 5, at the American Lutheran church in Fort Collins, Colo., when Miss Dorothy M. West, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. W. West, former local residents, became the bride of Norman W. Eyl, son of Mr. and Mrs. Otto G. Eyl of Madison, Neb.,

The Rev. E. F. Wendt, pastor of the church, read the nuptial vows at three o'clock in the presence of a large group of relatives and friends. Large baskets of colorful garden flowers intermingled with candleabra in which burned white tapers decorated the altar and formed an attractive background for the ceremony. Preceding the service Dr. Ruth Sumner sang "O Promise Me" and "I Love You Truly." The nuptial music was provided by Mrs. R. L. Davis who played the wedding marches on the organ and a short prelude before the ceremony.

The bride, who was given in marriage by her father, was lovely in traditional white satin fashioned princess style with a slight train. The bodice had a sweetheart neckline and long mutton sleeves. Her full length tulle veil was fastened to a cornet made from the same material as her gown and was covered with sequins. She wore white satin slippers and carried a shower bouquet of white gardenias and white rosebuds tied with satin ribbon. She wore a string of pearls and carried an old lace handkerchief which both belonged to her grandmother West.

Miss Marjorie Eyl, sister of the bridegroom, served as maid of honor and was attractive in a pink formal gown of marquisette embroidered with a lily of the valley figure. She wore a head dress of pink and white rosebuds and carried pink roses tied with a blue tulle bow from which hung long streamers. She wore matching satin sandals.

Pat Halj of Akron was best man and Terry Hall of Akron and Donald Lyvere of Denver were ushers. The men of the bridal party all wore tuxedos and white aster boutonieres except the groom who chose a rosebud from the brides bouquet.

Mrs. West, mother of the bride, wore a black crepe afternoon frock with black accessories and a corsage of gladioli with rosebud center. Mrs. Eyl, mother of the groom, was attired in navy blue with navy accessories and a similar corsage.

Following the ceremony a reception was held at the home of the bride's parents for relatives and a few friends. Mrs. Ernest Fischer of Ft. Collins and Mrs. Wilbur Hillman of State Center served as pourers at the table which was covered with a lace cloth and centered with a crystal bowl of roses. The wedding cake was three tiered and decorated with a miniature bride and groom.

The couple left that evening on a wedding trip to the Colorado mountains and upon their return are making their home at 624 South Loomis street, Ft. Collins. For her traveling costume the bride chose a black crepe dress with black accessories and a gardenia corsage.

The bride is a graduate of the State Center high school and Chilli-cothe business college and has been employed in secretarial work for the extension service of Colorado State college. Mr. Eyl is a student of veterinary medicine at Colorado State College and is a member of Lambda Chi Alpha fraternity. He is a 2nd Lieut. in the reserve commissioned officers of the Medical Administration army of the United States.

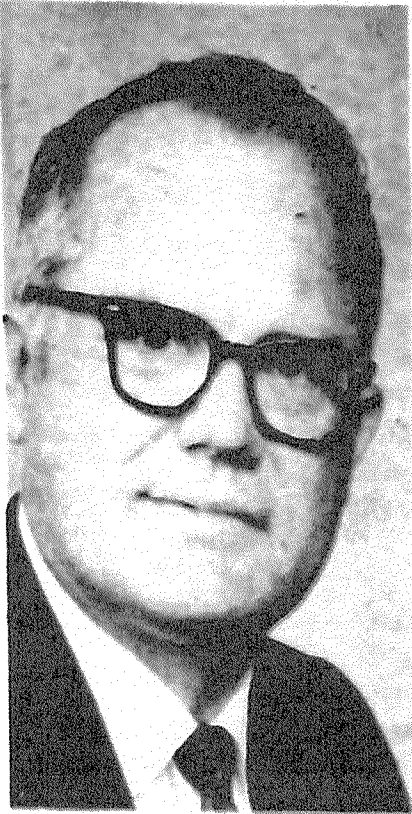
