

County Scholarships Go To N.P., Hubbard Trio

Mrs. Delores Horn and Mrs. Clara Wilson, New Providence, and John Weld, Hubbard, have been selected as recipients of the Hardin Soil Conservation District and Pine Lake Wildlife Club scholarships to the Iowa Teachers Conservation Camp at Springbrook Park near Guthrie Center.

The two organizations annually award scholarships to defray the cost of tuition of teachers and students to the camp.

Mrs. Wilson, seventh and eighth grade teacher at New Providence, was awarded one of the Pine Lake Wildlife Club scholarships. Mrs. Horn, third grade teacher at New Providence, and John Weld, a student at Iowa State Teachers College, Cedar Falls, were awarded the Hardin Soil Conservation District scholarships. One additional scholarship is available through the Wildlife Club.

A teacher may choose to go to any of three sessions and earn three semester hours of college credit. The first session begins June 5, the second June 26, and the third July 17.

The camp, now in its eleventh year of operation, is a regular college course but differs in that a major portion of the instruction is done in the field. Most of the field instruction is done by guest specialists from various state and federal agencies. These field trips aid the teachers in learning conservation by observing natural resources and seeing the actual conservation practices put into use.

Modern facilities and recreational opportunities give this summer school a vacation like atmosphere. Fishing, swimming and boating may be enjoyed on the 27 acre lake.
