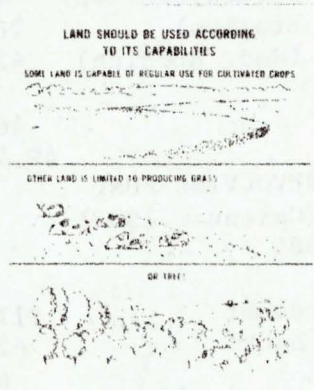

PERSONNEL CHANGES

Phillip Melvin, District Commissioner for 14 years, moved from his farm in Wyacondah Township to Bloomfield in March. The move made him ineligible to serve. He continues as Assistant Commissioner and Treasurer. Wayne Birchmier was appointed to complete the year and was elected to complete Phillip's term in the November election. Don Herteen chose not to run for re-election and Ray More was elected to serve a 6-year term. The Soil Commissioners and Board of Supervisors cooperated in installing two RC&D roadside structures. The Soap Creek Watershed Farmer Committee, with help from the staff of the 4 counties involved, has met several times to help keep the project moving toward reality.

During the past year we have seen some changes in our local office staff. Roger Fry, State Engineering Aide, retired April 30, 1984. The District Soil Commissioners interviewed eight applicants to fill the vacancy and selected Wayne Mason, local farmer, to begin work June 1, 1984. Julie Falcon was selected to train in the SCS Upward Mobility program which includes completing her college degree and working, as time permits with class schedules, in the local office. We were fortunate to have Christine Crossett volunteer to help work as a technician and Patty Hainline volunteered as a clerk - both serving part-time during the year as they had time. We thank them for doing this. Lori Altheide, Randy Herteen and Dean Stocker worked part-time during the fall, helping with survey of possible sites in the 4-county area of Soap Creek Watershed.

The District Commissioners and Office Staff want to thank farmers and contractors for their assistance in helping to increase the soil conserving practices needed to help save our soil and make the land productive for future generations.

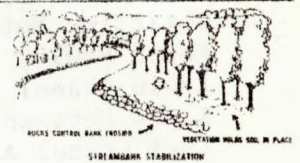
