The Rev. Elmer J. Braun solemnized the double ring ceremony at seven-thirty o'clock before a large number of relatives and friends. Slender white tapers glowed in seven branch candelabra on the altar and reflected tiny halos of light down the white satin carpeted aisle which was outlined with satin bow marked pews.

Mrs. Amil Vajgrt presided at the organ for the nuptial music playing a prelude of appropriate numbers and accompanying Richard Brandt, soloist, who sang, "O Perfect Love," "Today O Lord We At Thine Altar Stand" and "The Lord's Prayer". The traditional wedding marches were used for the processional and recessional.

The diminutive bride, given in marriage by her brother, Franklin Shenkle, was a picture of youthful loveliness in her bridal gown of white nylon tulle over slipper satin. BOB MEIER IS BACK FROM NAVAL CRUISE

During the cruise the Los Angeles visited Japan, Hawaii, and Hong Kong. At Shimoda, Japan, she participated in the Black Ship Festival commemorating the visit of Commodore Matthew Perry and the opening of Japan to Western trade, and at Nagoya, Japan, was visited by 30,000 people during an Open House.

BOB MEIER TAKING PART IN NAVAL TRAINING EXERCISE PACIFIC FLEET (FHTNC) —

Robert C. Meier, seaman apprentice, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Meier of State Center, Iowa, serving aboard the heavy cruiser USS Los Angeles, is taking part in a large fleet training exercise off the coast of Southern California, Nov. 2-6, involving units of the U.S. Pacific Fleet.

The exercise, under the direction of the Commander of the First Fleet, is pitting "Blue" attack carrier striking forces against opposing "Orange" defensive forces. The Blue forces are launching carrier aircraft attacks and simulated guided missile attacks on a large land mass. The Orange defenders are attempting to stop them with Navy carrier and land-based aircraft and surface craft.

Submarines are practicing attacks on the groups during the early phases of the exercise.

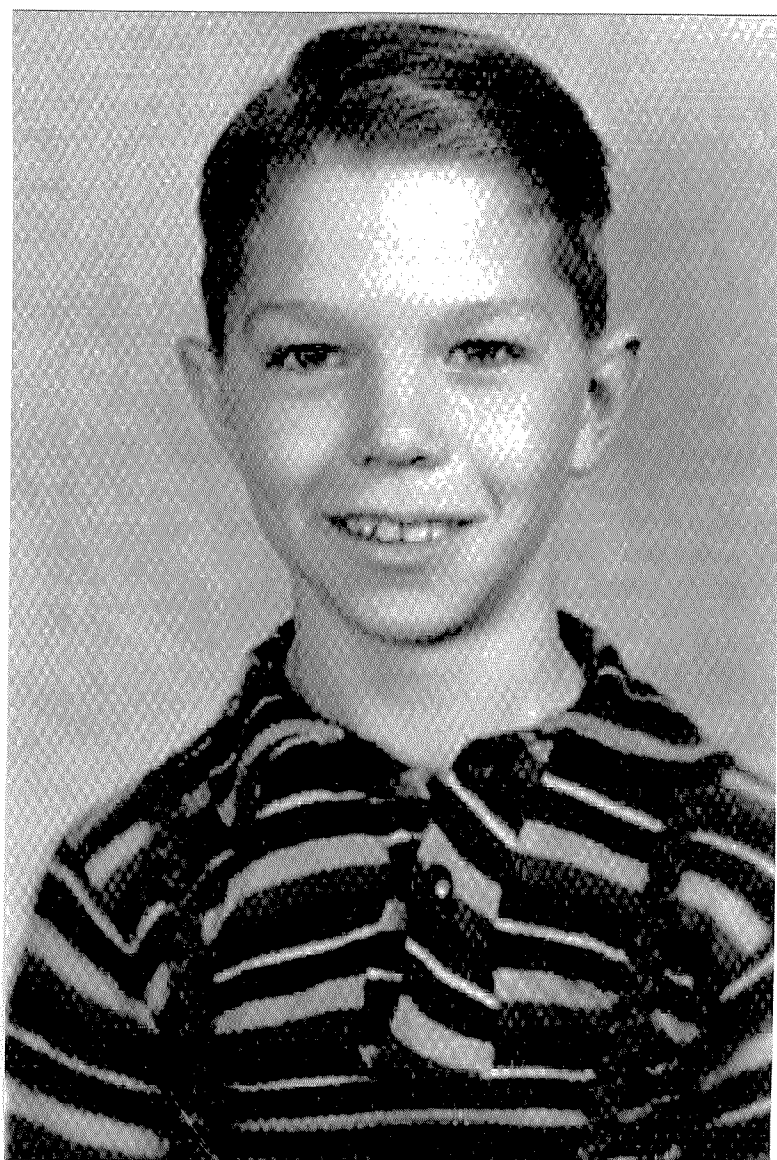
Operations of this type are designed to prepare units of the First Fleet for deployment to the Far East and duty with the U.S. Seventh Fleet.
