Explanation of Purpose--

This plant has been constructed and the business organized by E. Tyden of Hastings, Michigan, who owns and operates nearly 2,500 acres of land, near Dougherty, for the purpose of better filling his stock feeding needs. Stock feeding is done on a large scale on the Tyden farms, and it was necessary to construct the plant, and have a warehouse available for the increase of feeds which will be necessary.

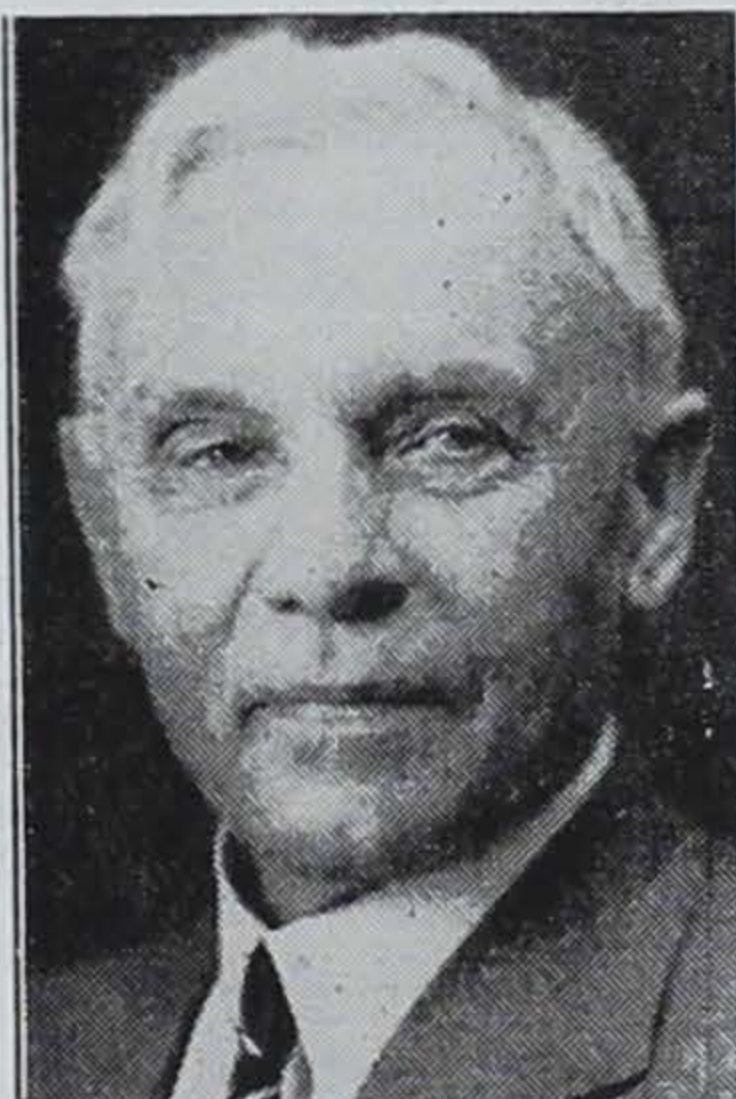
In building this plant, there has been made possible an opportunity for the farmers of northern Iowa to receive advantages from this program. Feeds will be sold retail and wholesale. They will be manufactured according to each farmer's needs.



He Knows FEEDS--

One of Iowa's recognized feed and livestock experts, George Cook, who has been associated with feeds, grains and livestock feeding businesses for 18 years, is in charge of the new Dougherty plant. He has been connected with the Albert Dickinson Co., of Chicago, Illinois, the Grain Marketing association of Chicago, the Acme Feeds corporation and the Honeymead Feed company. His work has

been principally selling feeds and supervising the feeding of livestock.



Man of VISION--

Head of this great agricultural farming, feed and livestock program is E. Tyden, a man of vision, who believes in Iowa agriculture to the extent that he has invested thousands of dollars in this part of the state. Purchasing Finest Cattle - - -

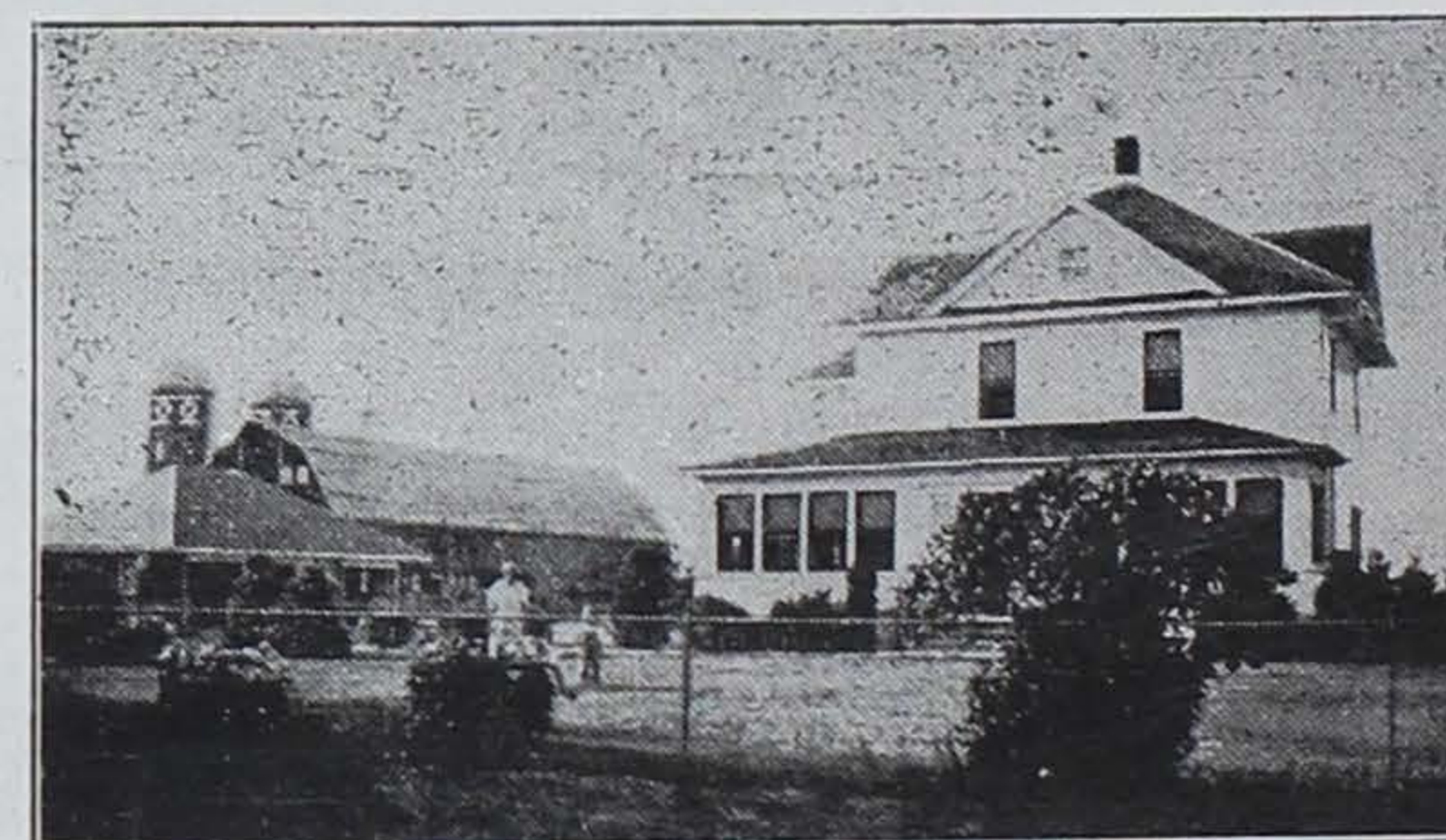
