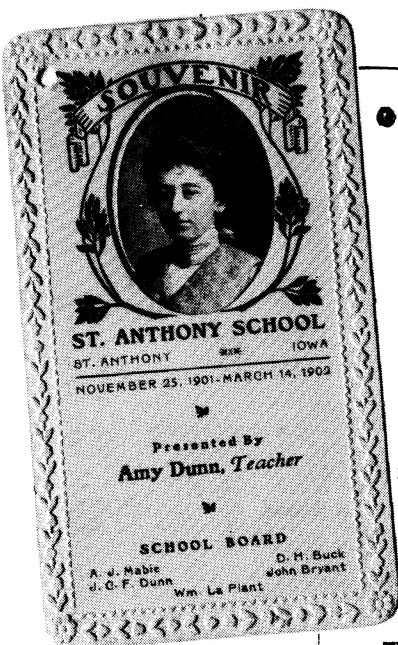

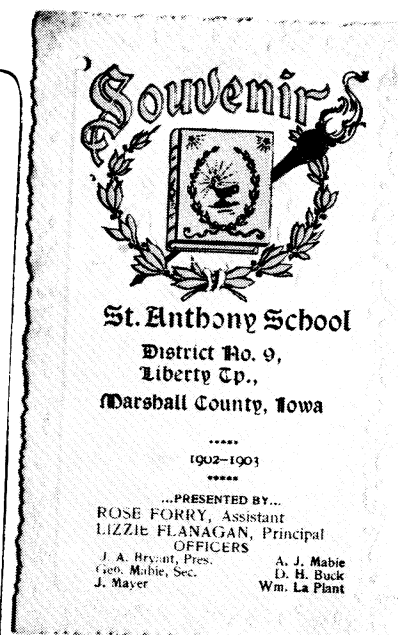


Wooden school in Saint Anthony (photo circa 1895)

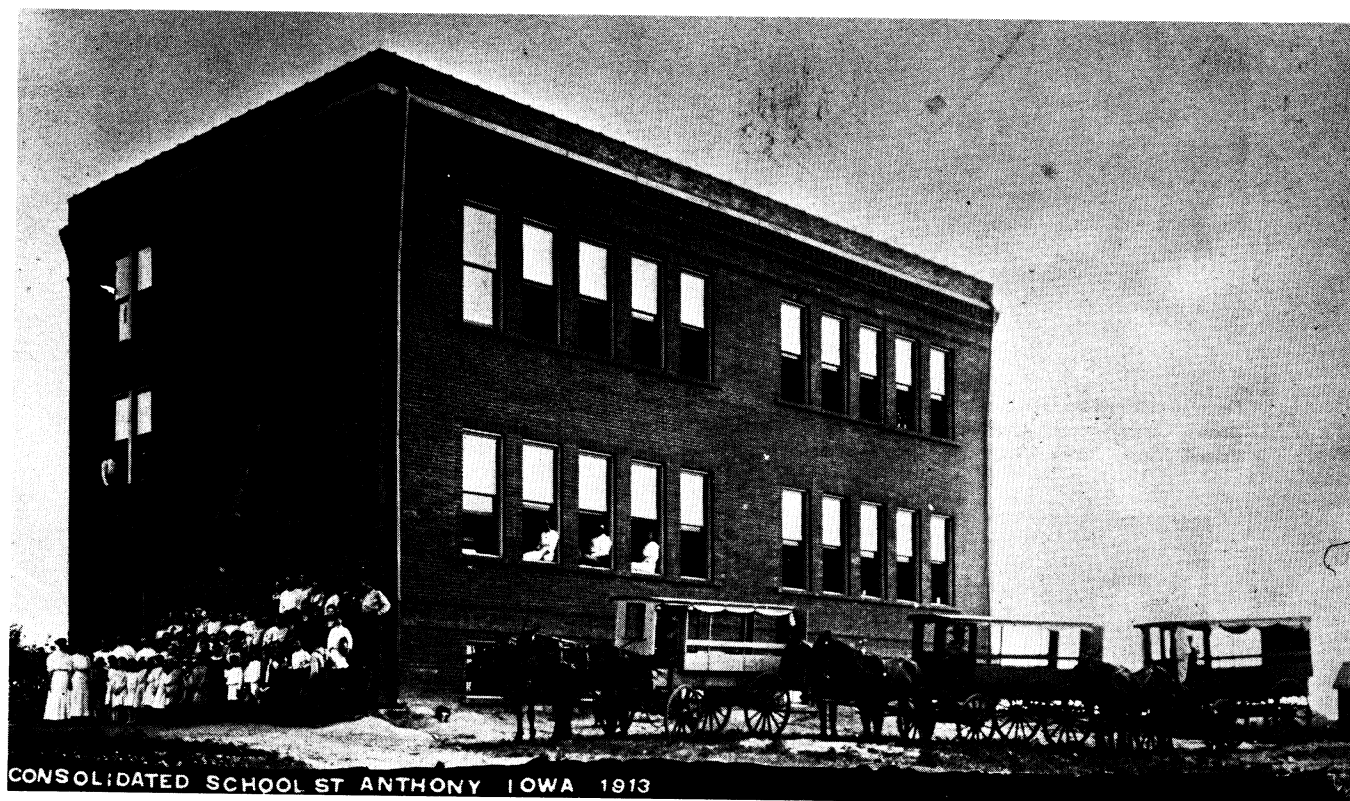
