Corn Yield Study In Fayette County

A corn yield study has been conducted in Fayette County the last several years by United States Soil Conservation Service and Iowa Agricultural Experiment Station. The study is conducted for period of ten years. This project should not be confused with corn yield tests that have been run by the county corn club.

The study is unique in that the primary objective is to determine for various soils of the state, the crop yield level that is attainable under different soil and crop management practices and different environments as well as climatic conditions. Other objectives include determination of proper levels of management being used by farmers in crop production. Yields will be analyzed in various soils and field shapes, and under various types of management and conservation practices.

Early in July technicians from S.C.S. and I.A.S. visit farms which have been planted to corn. Sixty different farms were selected in Fayette county for the study.

The stalks are counted and a record is made with pictures of the plants performed, such as plant height, number of ears per plant, tillage practices used, and approximate date corn was planted. Small Watershed Projects Effective Means Of Control

Experience in hundreds of watersheds demonstrates that multiple purpose small watershed projects are an effective means for rural and urban communities to deal with land use and water problems.

Since 1945, when the Watershed Protection and Flood Prevention Act (Public Law 565) was enacted, more than 100,000 small watershed projects have been planned or completed. These projects have shown that they can help uncheck soil erosion and control water runoff on rural lands, and that they can improve drainage conditions on land in agricultural production, provide for water for growing municipal needs, attract new industries, enhance fish and wildlife resources, and provide developments for recreation.
