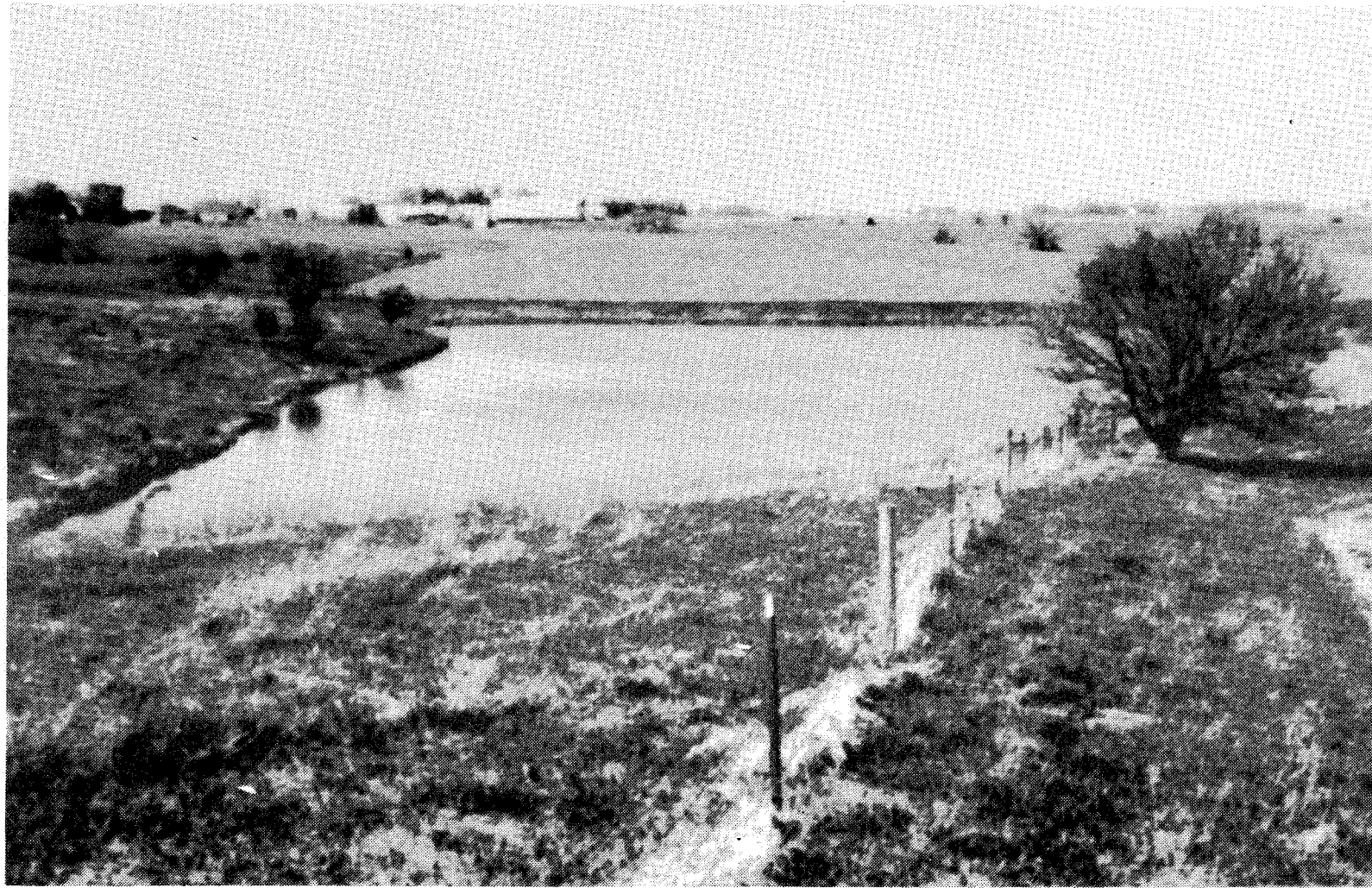

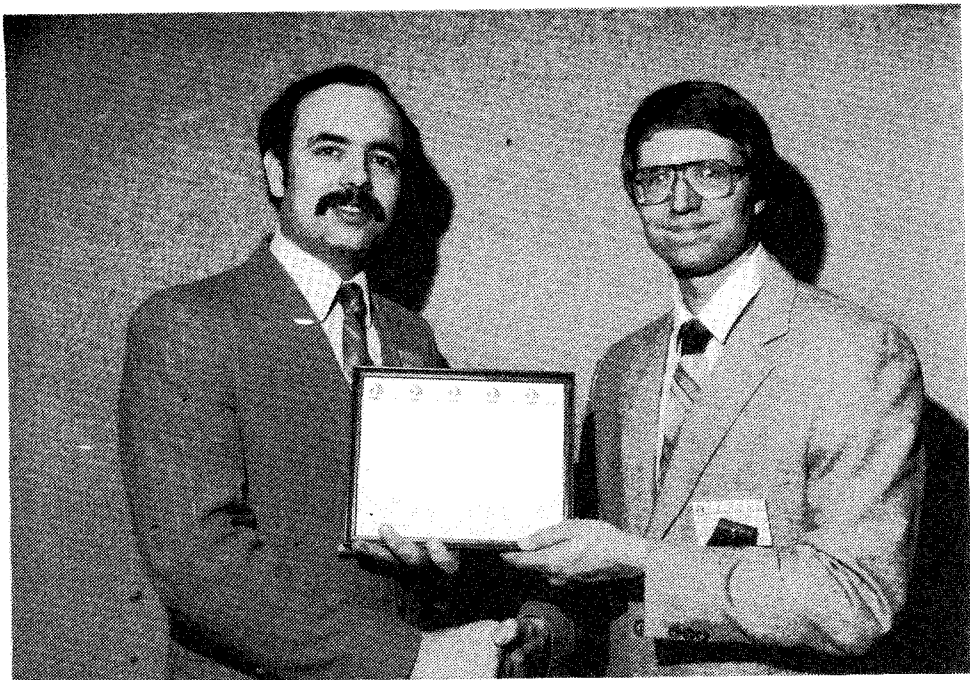
Owner-Operator Award: Hugh O'Meara, Williamsburg, was cited for his soil conservation program at the 1986 awards event.



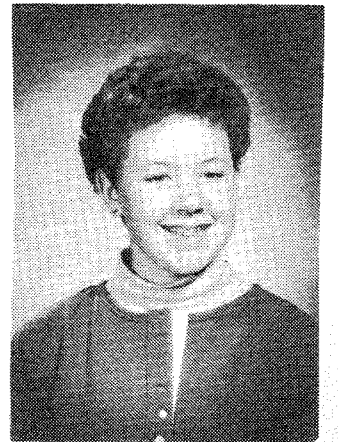
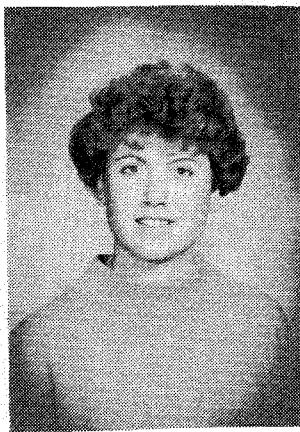

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No residue

Conventional plowing leaves little or no residue on the soil surface.



1500 pounds per acre

At least this much residue must be left to save soil with conservation tillage.



3000 pounds per acre

This amount of residue cuts soil loss to half that from conventional forms of tillage.



5000 pounds per acre

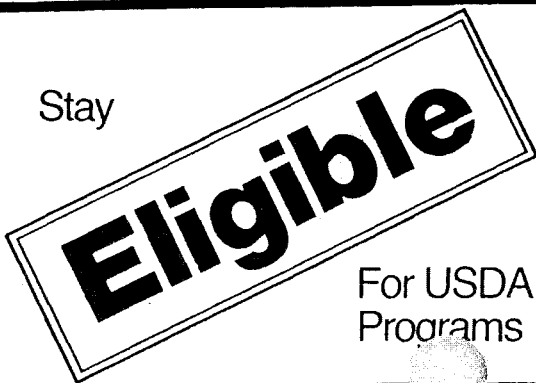
On longer and steeper slopes, more residue is needed to control erosion.
