

Plan Conservation Meeting For Wed.

A study of Soil and Water Conservation needs of Hardin County will be conducted at a meeting in the County Extension office conference room Wednesday, March 11, according to Cal Moore, Chairman of the committee.

The committee, composed of representatives of local agricultural agencies and farm organizations, will consider land use today as compared to expected changes by 1975. Programs of watershed projects and conservation practices will be discussed.

The study is part of a national effort being conducted by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The project will compile a needs inventory for every county in the nation by 1960. The data will enable better planning of programs needed to improve the soil and water resources.
