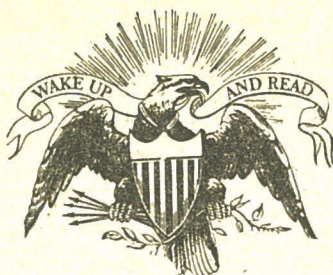

Triplet Girls to Couple at Conrad

Triplet girls were born to Mr. and Mrs. Willard H. Dielschneider of Conrad last Friday at the Evangelical hospital, Marshalltown—giving the young couple eight children, the oldest 8 years of age.

The first of the triplet girls was delivered at 9:25 a.m. and weighed 3 pounds 15¼ oz.; the second at 10:17 a.m., weighed 4 pounds 11¼ oz.; and the third at 12:24 p.m., weighed 5 pounds 2½ oz.

All of the babies are sound and healthy, although the smallest has been placed in an incubator. Dr. Edward Jacobs of Conrad delivered the triplets.

The Dielschneiders, who live on a farm near Conrad, have five other children, ranging in age from 20 months to 8 years. There are two girls and three boys.

Hospital records show this was the first triplets born at Marshalltown since February, 1952.
