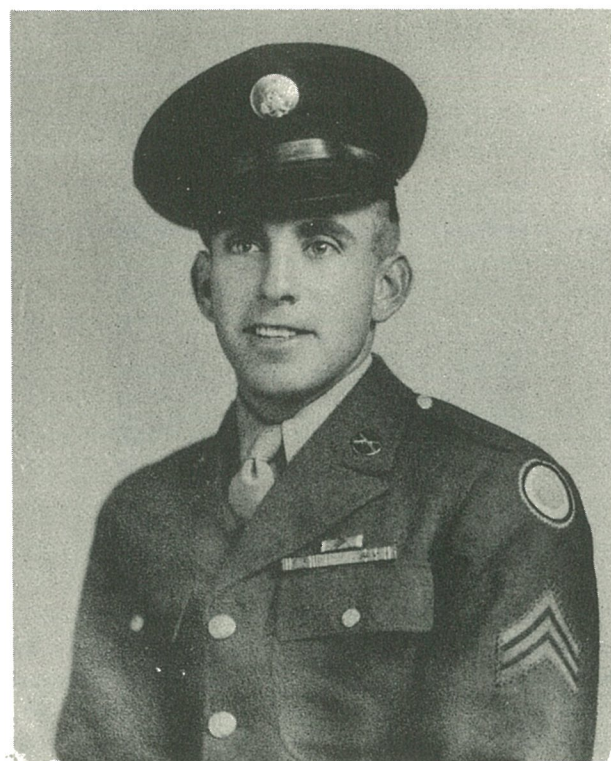




Sgt. GORDON ROWE

Infantry, 34th Division in Marshalltown, Iowa. Stationed at
Camp Claiborne, Louisiana, and Ft. Dix, New Jersey.
Landed in England, May 12, 1942. Took part in North
African and Italian Campaigns. Wounded February 1, 1943
at Seved Station, Tunisia.
Received Purple Heart, Silver Star, Oak Leaf Cluster,
Returned to U.S. March 1944. Stationed at Ft. George G.
Meade, Maryland.
Honorable Discharge June 16, 1945, at Ft. Dix, New Jersey.

Inducted into service March 18, 1942, at Ft. Des Moines,
Iowa. Basic training at Jefferson Barracks, Missouri.
Attended Air Corps Schools at Glendale, Burbank, and
Santa Monica, California. Trained as Air Corps Mechanic.
Arrived in England December 2, 1942, where he served as
a Crew Chief, of the 336th Fighter Squadron, Received
E.T.O. and African T.O. Ribbons, Bronze Battle Star,
Good Conduct Medal, District Unit Badge.
Honorable Discharge September 28, 1945.
