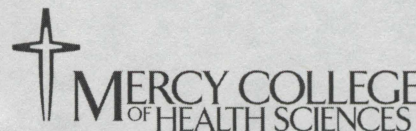

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MERCY COLLEGE COLLABORATES WITH URBAN DREAMS

THE CARING HANDS OF HEALTHCARE: CAREERS THAT CAN CHANGE THE WORLD

MERCY COLLEGE was approached by **WAYNE FORD** of Urban Dreams and asked to collaborate with their Full Service Community Schools program at Moulton School and Harding Middle School. The goal of the program was to share information with elementary and middle school students about careers in the health sciences and to motivate and interest them in careers in healthcare.

The first phase of the program was coordinated by Dr. Jennifer Bradley. It started in April 2005 and involved 91 students at the two schools. The program lasted six weeks and consisted of presentations in the various program disciplines, i.e., nursing, radiology, surgical technology, nuclear medicine, diagnostic medical sonography, and medical assisting. Participants included students in three age groups: kindergarten to second grade, third and fourth grade, and fifth through eighth grade.

There were twenty-four presentations

that included PowerPoint, games, experimentation with devices and equipment, videos, role-playing and coloring books.

Mercy College recruited and benefited from the volunteer hours of 25 staff/faculty members and 28 students.

Urban Dreams has requested the continuation of the program for the Fall 2005 semester. Dr. Sapphire Cureg is leading the next phase of the program with a special focus at Moulton School. A few changes will be made to allow for increased efficiency and optimization of time and human resources. This semester, all third, fourth, and fifth grade students are combined in a single class size of 42. The method of instruction remains relatively unchanged.
