

Suzanne Hult Wins Regional Queen Honors Aug 1963

Suzanne Hult, 18, Swedesburg, was named winner of the Regional Queen of Conservation contest held last night as part of the entertainment at the Jefferson county Junior Agricultural show.

She was named winner over a field of eight contestants representing four counties in southeast Iowa.

As a result of her winning the regional contest here, Miss Hult will represent the southeast Iowa region in the State Queen of Conservation contest to be held next month.

Lovely Miss Hult is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. LaVerne Hult of Swedesburg. The family resides on an 80 acre farm, but the father farms a total of 220 acres. She attended Waco high school at Olds from which she was graduated last spring. She plans to enter nurses training in Des Moines this fall. Miss Hult represented Henry county.
