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There's a new industry in our neighborhood. It's the Kaufmann Feed Mill at Beaman and it's another of those interesting father and son partnerships. W. C. Kaufmann is the senior member of the firm. His twin sons, Donald and Ronald are the junior members. The operation is on the 80 acres owned by the Kaufmanns, directly south of Beaman. There, a complete feed processing plant has been installed. Franchise rights on a popular feed formula have been secured and the plant is now in daily operation. It's capacity finally will be many tons of feed daily and the output will be readily taken by farmers of the neighborhood and by others in this area who have found the feeding operation more successful through a good balanced ration with a properly mixed feed as a supplement.

Facilities for the new program are about as complete as one could ask for, elevators, a modern mixer, grinders, graders, and whatnot. With the feed business will also be incorporated other activities of the father-son triumverate, including seed oats, seed beans, probably fertilizers and other essential farm commodities. A phase of the operation is the farming of 580 acres of this good Vienna township land. Two hired men are employed in the farm program.
