One of the largest real estate deals made in the county for some time was consummated Friday when Oscar Gohlke completed the arrangements for the transfer of the stock of merchandise formerly owned by The 2 Hillemans. Mr. Gowdy commenced invoicing Tuesday and is now in possession of the store, though negotiations are pending for another transfer to a Cedar Rapids firm.

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Fred Hilleman Died at His Home Here Thursday

Death Comes to State Center Resident After Illness of Five Years

Fred A. Hilleman, a well known resident of this city, died at 5:00 o'clock Thursday morning after an illness of about five years. He had been bedfast since August. Death was due to complications of heart and kidney trouble.

Mr. Hilleman was born on Sept. 26, 1854, in Hagenbeck, Brunswick, Germany, and came to this country with his mother in 1866, settling near Plano, Ill. The following year they came to Iowa and settled on a farm northeast of this city in Marietta township. In 1878 he and his mother moved to the farm now occupied by his son Wilbert.

On October 20, 1881, he was married to Miss Marie Garbelman, in the French Grove Lutheran church, the ceremony being performed by Rev. C. F. Hermann. In 1894 Mr. and Mrs. Hilleman moved to State Center, and have since made their home here. They celebrated their golden wedding anniversary October 20, last year.

Six children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Hilleman, four of whom survive, with their mother. They are Wilbert and Harvey Hilleman and Mrs. A. W. West, of State Center and Mrs. Ernest Fischer of Fort Collins, Colo. Nine grandchildren and six great grandchildren also survive.

The funeral services were held at St. Paul's Lutheran church of this city at 2:00 o'clock Sunday afternoon, following a prayer service at the home at 1:30, with Rev. A. H. Schultz, pastor of the church in charge. The pallbearers were August, Henry, Albert, Emil, William and Charles Hilleman. The flowers were cared for by Mrs. Harold Hilleman and Misses Gladys Hilleman, Irene Schaper, Edith Schaper, Lois Hilleman, Frances Hilleman, Gertrude Gerke, Florence and Wynona Eggers, Helen Gray and Rosella Frohwein.

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MRS. F. A. HILLEMANN PIONEER RESIDENT DIES ON SATURDAY

Mrs. Marie Hilleman, 80, widow of the late F. A. Hilleman, passed away at her home in State Center Saturday morning after an illness of several days with pneumonia. Mrs. Hilleman had been in declining health for several years and for the past several months had been seriously ill.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at two o'clock at St. Paul's Lutheran Church with the Rev. H. P. Kumpf, officiating. A prayer service was held at the W. C. Hilleman home at one-thirty. Burial was made in Hillside cemetery.

Mrs. Hilleman was born Anna Maria Garblmann, April 29, 1864 on a farm four miles north of State Center. She was the daughter of George and Barbara Kunkel Garblmann, who were born in Hannover, Germany. She was married to Frederick A. Hilleman, on Oct. 20, 1881 by the Rev. C. F. Hermann at St. John's Lutheran church, where she was baptized in 1864 and confirmed in 1877. For the past several years she had been a member of St. Paul's Lutheran church. Mr. Hilleman, who at one time was an extensive land owner in western Marshall county preceded her in death on Oct. 27, 1932. Two children also preceded her in death.

Mr. and Mrs. Hilleman lived on the farm now owned by W. C. Hilleman, northeast of State Center, until 1894, when they moved to town, although they continued to operate a smaller farm. They retired in 1916 and the following year built the home where she passed away and where she had been cared for by her son, W. C. Hilleman and his wife, who had lived with her the past five years.

Mr. and Mrs. Hilleman were the parents of six children four of whom are surviving. They are W. C. and Harvey A. Hilleman of State Center; Mrs. A. W. West and Mrs. Ernest Fisher, both of Fort Collins, Colo. She is also survived by three half brothers, nine grandchildren and nine great grandchildren.
