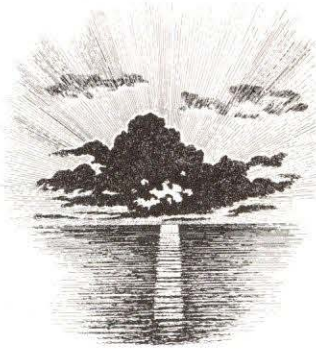

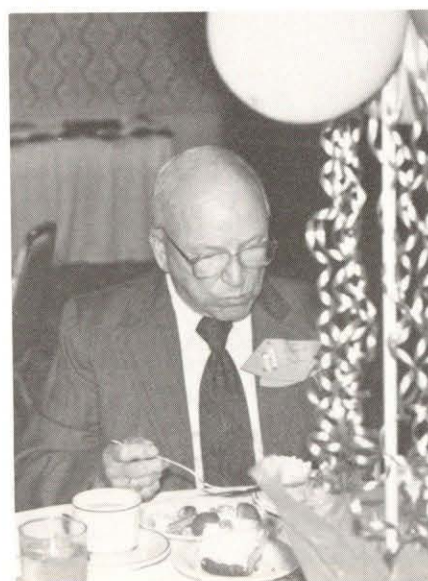

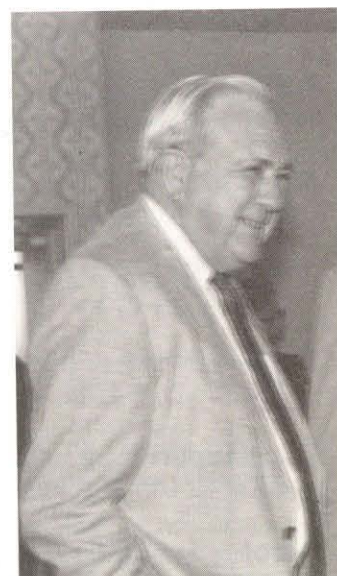

PRIVATE MOMENTS by Neil Naiden
(The speech he didn't make)

I graduated from SUI Law School in 1941. I already had two newspaper jobs go out from under me and had spent all the money I made as a newspaper correspondent in Iowa City joy riding in Mexico. My father was gone; I was 23 and broke. So I borrowed a hundred bucks and left, both wondering and wandering. But the Marshalltown experience stayed with me. As the years went by I finally figured out why.

This is a different place. The people that have come out of it tell you why. Adrian Constantine Anson was the first and the most famous. He was born in 1851, and 1876 to 1898 he was the best baseball player in the world. He played for - you guessed it - the CUBS. There was no other sport then, no basketball, or football or track. He had over 3,000 hits in 9,000 at bats, struck out only 294 times, batted .399 one year and .395 another.

There were two women physicians in this town before 1900. The town became a county seat by brute strength and awkwardness in 1853, although it wasn't official until 1859, when the state finally caved in and made this town the county seat. I speak of the so-called Marietta War.

Have Jake tell you how Fisher started - it was because winter was cold and riding a bicycle as Bill Fisher's gramps had to do to get to the waterworks whenever there was a fire wasn't any fun. He had to turn up the boilers that pumped the water - so he invented the steam governors to stay out of the cold. Find something to compare with that.

We have had three movie stars - John Qualen, Jean Seberg and Mary Beth (Supinger) Hurt. We have our own Merle Miller, who has written a dozen or so books and another writer by the name of Ruth Carlson who wrote a book that James Thurber called a work of genius. It is entitled "Moon Over the Back Fence." There are the Paddocks who wrote "Hungry Nations," a world-famous book about feeding people in poor countries.

We had a wrestling champion, Aly Morrison. He never lost a match and won the 1928 Olympic 136-pound title. He was the best in the world, even if he did go to the University of Illinois.

Then there is the trowel factory, and Fisher's subsequent great success and the Lennox story. Try finding something similar in Boone, or in Newton (great place to buy a washing machine), or for that matter Waterloo or Cedar Rapids. One is tractors and the other is breakfast food.

We had three railroads here when we were in high school. And the buggy factory! And Jack Spratt! We have one of the few totally restored courthouses in the country. Thanks to Marshalltown's MIT Tau Beta Pi Engineer, John Norris. Yes, Marshalltown is truly a different place. You can see it all around you.

Years later, when I had been so many other places and also seen many other things, I would think about this town and these people. As Mark Twain said in India "All the me in me is halfway around the world in a small town in Missouri." Make it a small town in Iowa in my case. Merle made that same point here in 1963, and so I make it again. (I never did anything very special myself, but I did come from a special place. Maybe we are all a little special because of that.)
