

Queen Of The Furrow Contest Announced

A lovely farm girl from Hardin county could become Iowa's 1959 "Queen of the furrow." A glamorous wardrobe and a 21-jewel wrist watch await the lucky winner.

The "Queen of the Furrow" contest, which has become an Iowa summer tradition, once again is being co-sponsored by the State Soil Conservation Districts of Iowa, United States Steel Corporation and local American Fence dealers.

BESIDES HER prizes, the new queen will be the honored guest and hostess of the Annual conference of Soil Conservation District Commissioners to be held at the Hanford hotel in Mason City, Sept. 20-22. She also will reign over the State Field days and plowing matches taking place near Sioux City on Sept. 25.

The contest is open to single girls between the ages of 16 and 21, who live on a farm in Iowa. The queen will be chosen for her poise, personality, intelligence and personal attractiveness.

ENTRIES FOR the District contest in Hardin county are to be mailed by July 25 to be eligible. A luncheon will be held the following week to select the district winners.

The two district winners will receive stainless steel bracelets and will compete in this area's regional contest to be held at Boone county fair in Boone on Aug. 18.

LATER, THE nine winners from each of Iowa's nine regions will vie for the crown of "Queen of the Furrow" in the colorful state-wide contest to be held at the Hanford hotel in Mason City on Sept. 20, during the annual conference of soil conservation commissioners.
