This is one of three such structures planned by Appanoose County Engineers, SCD, and SCS in a short section of county road adjacent to the Rathbun Lake. SCS surveys and designs are employed using same criteria as PL-566 structures. The County Engineers contract and supervise the construction under regular road-building criteria.

THIS PICTURE SHOWS: Third conservation road structure built in Appanoose County under provisions of understanding between County Board of Supervisors and District Soil Commissioners. It was designed and constructed under same specifications as P.L. 566 program, but no federal funds are involved in construction. Maintenance also comes under regular county road funds. Farmers sign same easements as P.L. 566 and furnish all land, easements, and rights-of-way to county and SCD. There is a 305-acre drainage area; 4.4-acres of water surface; and a 24-inch corrugated metal pipe (hood inlet). Water is piped under road for livestock.

Grade stabilization, sediment storage and runoff control would be major conservation benefits. A similar structure is proposed to the left of the road curve in the background of the photo. These structures complement the recently completed P.L.566 watershed structural program in the Moulton Watershed.
