

Judges Selected For Soil Conservation Society Photo Contest

Judges for the photo contest for the Iowa Chapter of the Soil Conservation Society of America have just been announced.

THE JUDGES include Frank Mendell, state conservationist of the Soil Conservation Service, Bert Dieter of Meredith Publishing company, Marion Pease of Pease Pictures, Harry Linn of Iowa Manufacturers' association, all of Des Moines; and John C. Huseby of Photo Laboratory at Iowa State College at Ames.

These men will choose the winning black and white and the winning color entry with prizes up to \$50, but a total of 40 prizes in all, according to Ernest E. Behn of Boone, contest chairman.

Any person living in Iowa is eligible for this contest and the picture may cover any phase of soil conservation. It is the hope of the contest committee that pictures will arrive by the hundreds in the next few days and give the judges a real hard time in picking a winner. In this manner, the Iowa Chapter of the Soil Conservation Society of America also gets a splendid collection of good photos on soil conservation.

It is believed that the Iowa Chapter is the only one in the United States to have promoted a contest of this kind, so the planners of this effort are hoping for real success.
