

Marshall County Iowa Cemetery Locations

Bangor Township

Bangor Cemetery is found in Section 17 of Bangor township between 125 St. & Hopkins Ave.

Bentley Cemetery is found in Section 3 of Bangor township. This cemetery appears to be abandoned. Also referred to as **Bunch Cemetery**. In 1854 Joseph Chapin Bentley gave a 1-acre portion of his land for this Cemetery when his friend Joshua Bunch passed away. Joshua was the first burial here. The cemetery is no longer in use and there are very few markers left. Only 4-5 of the markers are readable in 2010. Most of the remaining markers are broken and are simply piled near where they were lying. The family living nearby does the mowing and keeps the sign painted.

Everist Cemetery section 32 of Bangor township, appears abandoned (aka Welsey Chapel or Hazel Green)

Morman Ridge Cemetery has not been located as of 2008. It may be in Section 33 or 34 of Bangor township.

Whitaker Family Burying Ground is found in Section 28 of Bangor township.

Eden Township

Day Cemetery This cemetery is located southwest of Rhodes in the northwestern part of Section 30 in Eden Township. Also known as the **Ball Cemetery**. The cemetery was canvassed by Barbara and Larry Price in 1974. A notation was made that the cemetery was abandoned in 1974. It is currently being taken care of.

Eden Cemetery this cemetery is located east of Rhodes in Section 10 in Eden Township. Also known as the **Rhodes Cemetery**.

Nicholls Cemetery (Price Cemetery or the Culver Cemetery) is located in Section 4 of Eden township, north of the town of Rhodes. Directions below provided by Jerry Hale. Location: NE ¼ of Section 4 Eden Twp., 2 Miles north of Rhodes on the west side of Cooper Ave. (County Road S52).

Saint Josephs Cemetery This cemetery is located east of Rhodes in Section 10 in Eden Township on County Highway E63. This cemetery is adjacent to the Eden/Rhodes Cemetery.

Green Castle Township

Prairie View Cemetery is found in Section 26 of Green Castle township. Also known as the **Gilman Cemetery**.

Strand Lutheran Cemetery This cemetery is located on the east edge of Dunbar in Section 1 in Green Castle Township. Also known as the **Dunbar Cemetery**.

Jefferson Township

Graceland Cemetery This cemetery is located west of Laurel in Section 27 in Jefferson Township.

Immaculate Conception Cemetery This cemetery is in the southeast area of Haverhill in Jefferson Township. Directions from Haverhill: Head south on Main St. Turn east on 1st Street and the cemetery should be at end of the road. No section listed.

Methodist Cemetery This cemetery is in the western part of Section 22 in Jefferson Township. Also known as the **Dunton Cemetery**.

Saint John's United Disciples of Christ Cemetery This cemetery is in the northeast corner of Section 19 in Jefferson Township.

Sea Captains Grave Jefferson Township – SE section 6 (see written doc for more info)

Iowa Township

Gaer Ballard Cemetery is found in Section 36 of Iowa township. This cemetery is abandoned and almost completely destroyed. Also known as **Arney Cemetery, Dent Cemetery, Dawson Cemetery and Poling Cemetery**. Directions from Albion: Head north on IA-330 N/North Main St., turn left onto 160th St., turn right onto Langford Ave., turn left onto 155th St., and cemetery will be on your left. This is the oldest cemetery in Marshall County. The original owner was Sheldon Gaer, and now owned by Mike and Shelly Walton. The original cemetery plat was down by the North road (155th Street) and was moved to the center of the field. Deed does not show date when moved. This cemetery was so hidden with growth as to cover all traces of the cemetery and many stones were broken, missing & buried under the dirt. The cemetery has now been restored; stones repaired, buried ones have been dug up, cleaned, and placed with the other stones. It stands proudly like it should for these pioneer folks. Some stones are missing as people took the stones several years ago before the present owner bought the property. The first burial was John Ballard. The last burial was that of James Hamblin on 29 Nov 1897. Note: Daniel Marling death date has never been confirmed. This was before Marshall County was settled. Was reported in the 1875 Iowa Andreas Atlas there was a body of a Mormon Pilgrim who spent the winter of 1844 – 45 in the area.

Bethel Grove Cemetery section 26 – Iowa township. Also referred to as Bethel Grove – Hauser – Disciples of Christ Cemetery.

Albion Cemetery Iowa township, section 8.

LeGrand Township

LeGrand Friends Cemetery This cemetery is located west of the town of LeGrand and the northeast corner of Section 14 in LeGrand Township.

Pleasant Hill Cemetery This cemetery is located north of LeGrand in Section 12 in LeGrand Township.

Stavanger Cemetery is found in Section 26 of LeGrand township. This cemetery is well maintained. The cemetery is between LeGrand and Dunbar on the west side of Highway 146.

Trinity Lutheran Cemetery (German Evangelical Lutheran Cemetery) LeGrand township.

Rock Valley Cemetery This cemetery is located in the southeast corner of Section 8 in LeGrand Township. Also known as the **Ralls Cemetery**. Located about 3 miles West of LeGrand on US Highway 30. Cemetery will be on North side of Highway.

Lutheran Evangeline Cemetery This cemetery is located in the southwest corner of Section 27 in LeGrand Township. Also known as the **Dillon Lutheran Cemetery**.

Liberty Township

Saint John's Cemetery is found in Section 3 of Liberty township. Also known as the **Dunn Cemetery**.

Bevins Grove Cemetery is found in Section 26 of Liberty township.

Illinois Grove Cemetery is found in Section 7 of Liberty township.

Linn township

Riverside Cemetery is found in Section 28 of Linn township. This cemetery is well maintained and has a cemetery office on the grounds. The cemetery is at the intersection of North 1st St. & Center St. in Marshalltown

Iowa Soldier's Home This cemetery is found between 13th Street and 9th Street on Summit Street in Section 27 of Marshall/Linn township (inside Marshalltown).

Rose Hill Memorial Gardens Cemetery This cemetery is found between South Center street and 12th Ave on old US Hwy 30 in Marshall/Linn township (just outside Marshalltown).

Woodland Cemetery This cemetery is now **part of Riverside Cemetery** in Marshall/Linn township (inside Marshalltown).

1ST CEMETERY IN MARSHALLTOWN This cemetery was located near the present Iowa Soldiers Home Cemetery. The graves were moved to Riverside Cemetery in Marshall/Linn township (inside Marshalltown).

Liscomb Township

Liscomb Cemetery is currently found in Section 12 of Liscomb township. There was another Liscomb Cemetery located in Section 11 of Liscomb township. The cemetery was destroyed and most of the graves were moved to the present Liscomb Cemetery.

Logan Township

Fairview Cemetery section 31 NW corner Logan Township. An initial search had been done many years ago and recorded. There were two stones readable. Some think this cemetery was broken into by a grader ditch when the road was surfaced. In 1997 it was found it had been fenced off with a heavy wire fence around the plot and a barbed wire farming fence running through the middle of the cemetery. Only one stone with the name Hancock is still standing.

Logan Cemetery This cemetery is in the southwest corner of Section 14 in Logan Township. Also known as the **Gowdy Cemetery**.

Melbourne Memorial Garden Cemetery This cemetery is in the northwest corner of Section 8 in Logan Township.

Marietta Township

Hartland Friends Cemetery found in southeast Section 15 of Marietta township.

Hixite Cemetery (Hicksite) is found in Section 13 of Marietta township (2117 190th st). Also known as **Heacock cemetery**.

Marietta Cemetery is found in Section 24 of Marietta township. This cemetery is well maintained. Marietta Cemetery is one of the oldest in Marshall County. Burials started there in 1850. It is located West of Marshalltown along Highway 330 South of Albion. The ground was purchased in 1859 and fifteen years later the Marietta Cemetery Company was incorporated.

Marion Township

Bowles Cemetery his cemetery is found in the northeast corner of Section 34 of Marion township. This cemetery is abandoned.

Green Mountain Cemetery Incorporated and platted on September 26, 1858. The Green Mountain Cemetery is located in the Village of Green Mountain, Marion Township, and is bordered on the North by Woolston Street (364¼ feet), on the West by Green Mountain Street (366 feet), on the South by Main Street (360¼ feet) and on the East by Somers Street (366 feet). Lots 341 to 368 consist of 2 grave sites. Lots 1 to 20 and 261 to 268 consist of 5 grave sites. The remaining lots consist of 6 grave sites. The grave sites within a lot are numbered from 1 to 6, North to South. All lots with 6 grave sites are 8 feet x 24 feet, the lots with 5 grave sites are 8x20 and the lots with 2 grave sites are 8x8. There is a 4 foot walkway around each lot and the south driveway is 16 feet wide and the north driveway is 18 feet wide. Green Mountain Cemetery is found in Section 10 of Marion township.

Iowa River Church of the Brethren Cemetery This cemetery is found in Section 28 of Marion township. Also known as the **Dunkard Cemetery**.

Quinn Cemetery is found in Section 18 of Marion township. This cemetery was walked in 1967 and has been plowed over and now it is just another field. Around 1970 there were 35 graves; 9 of one family. Located 3 miles north east of Marshalltown in Marion Township, situated on the old Henry Merrill farm. 80 rods west of the Nicholson Ford road to Green Mountain. In 1964 the farm was owned by Mike Lynch. Cemetery on W. M. Lynch farm on Highway 14 on road to Green Mountain.

Wallin Cemetery This cemetery is found in Section 27 of Marion township. It is 3 miles east of Marshalltown and a half mile south through a field near former town of Fredonia.

Minerva Township

Clemons Cemetery is found in Section 3 of Minerva township.

St, John's Lutheran section 27 of Minerva township. Also known as **French Grove cemetery**.

State Center Township

Hillside Cemetery Hillside Cemetery is found in Section 3 of State Center township.

Saint Joseph's Catholic Cemetery section 3 of State Center township.

Wilkey Cemetery section 25 of State Center township. Also known as **Church of the Brethren cemetery, Malta, Dunkard**. Two miles South of US 30 on Fairman Ave.

Taylor Township

Brown Cemetery South East ¼ of Section 13, Taylor Township.

Prairieville Cemetery is a Quaker cemetery also known as Mulsby Cemetery. It is found in the NE quarter of Section 34 of Taylor township. Cemetery land of 13 rods square was bought from Joshua Lloyd Esc. by the Trustee of Marshall Meeting Society of Friends on July 7, 1876.

Timber Creek Township

Center School Cemetery is found in Section 16 of Timber Creek township. (known as **Burns Community Cemetery**)

MAGERS CEMETERY This cemetery was formed long before Luray was a town in Timber Creek Township. It is located on the Riley Magers Farm in Section 19 near the town of Luray in Timber Creek Township. There is nothing there today. It is also known as the **Luray Cemetery**.

Timber Creek Cemetery is located in the south part of Section 26, Timber Creek Township, on 2671 Ridge Road, located 3.25 miles south of the junction of Highway 14 and old Highway 30, then a ¼ mile east and a ½ mile north on west side of the road.

Vienna Township

Chapel Hill Cemetery The road it is on is the dividing line between the two counties & the cemetery & church are on the Marshall side of the road. Chapel Hill Cemetery is found in Section 36 of Vienna township. Located in Section 36, just north of Chapel Church on land donated in 1873, by John Yetley. Frank Pifer donated more land later. In 1908, the ladies of the community met to organize the Ladies Cemetery Association with its purpose to arrange for the care and beautification of the cemetery.

Vienna Cemetery is found in Section 10 of Vienna township.

Washington Township

LaMoille Cemetery (Elmwood Cemetery) is found in Section 10 of Washington township.

Maple Grove Cemetery (aka Wickersham Cemetery) NORTHWEST ¼ OF SECTION 34 WASHINGTON TWP.

HAYNE –INDIAN BURYING GROUND section 1, Washington township. Researched the M. County Land, Death records and Local History books and can only find information of the site. There is no mention of what Indian Tribe/s or how many were buried there. In fact, there is a house built on the site.

Need Township Info

County Home Cemetery About 8 miles West of Marshalltown on highway #30 near the site of the Marshall County Sheriff's Office/Jail property is the old Marshall County Home Cemetery about ½ mile west of the existing building in an area that is mowed & fenced in. There may be about a dozen or so headstones in this fenced in area. Very few, one can even read the inscriptions.

Sacred Hearts Cemetery also known as **St. Anthony Cemetery**
