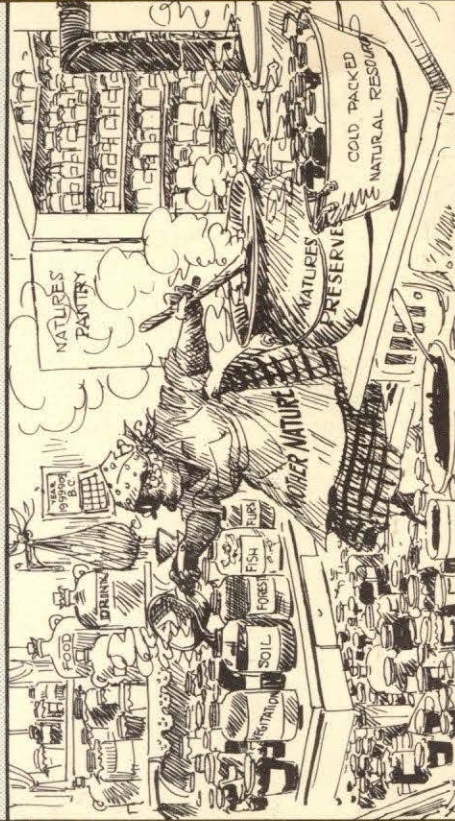

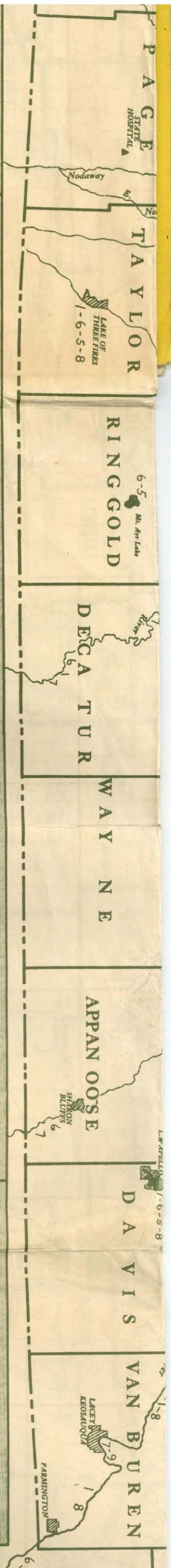

Quail—Nov. 15 to Dec. 15, shooting 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day.

Pheasants—Nov. 12 to Nov. 14, shooting 12 noon to 5 p.m. each day.

LICENSES

Fishing and hunting licenses are on sale at county recorders' offices, by state conservation officers and licensed depositaries.

Resident fishing license—\$1.00.

Resident hunting license—\$1.00.

Combination hunting and fishing license—\$1.50.

Non-resident fishing license (season)—\$3.00.

Non-resident fishing license (six day)—\$1.50.

Non-resident hunting license—\$15.00.

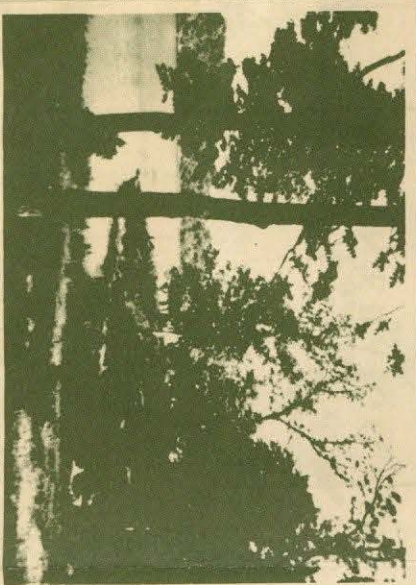

Parks and Preserves

Evidence of their popularity is the fact that more than 3,250,000 persons visited the Iowa State Parks and Preserves during 1939. Known for their fine scenery and rich in recreational facilities, many of the areas have historical and memorial associations that add to their desirability.

Picnicking, swimming, boating, camping, hiking and nature study are some of the types of recreation available in the Iowa State Parks and Preserves. Over-night cabins are available in some of the areas.

Hunting and Fishing

Iowa's many natural and artificial lakes and hundreds of miles of streams provide sporty angling for many game species of fishes. Fishing is permitted in the lakes and streams of many of the state parks, but hunting is not permitted in these areas.

Good hunting for many species of upland game and waterfowl is available in Iowa. Most of the hunting in the state is done over private lands, but 83 public shooting grounds have been provided for use by minnows.
