MARRIAGE RECORDS
STATE OF ILLINOIS, COUNTY OF KENDALL.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

TO ANY PERSON LEGALLY AUTHORIZED TO SOLEMNIZE MARRIAGE, GREETING:

You are hereby authorized to join in the Holy Bonds of matrimony, and to celebrate within this County the rites and ceremonies of marriage, between all persons who are of legal age and who are of the same blood, and you are required to return this license to me within thirty days from the celebration of such marriage, with a certificate of the same appended thereto and signed by you, under the penalty of One Hundred Dollars.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and the seal of said County, this 23rd day of April 1865.
