

Big Wyacondah Work Scheduled

BLOOMFIELD. — J. C. Whistler of Centerville was apparent low bidder for the second letting of construction projects for the Big Wyacondah Watershed. The contract is expected to be officially awarded in about 10 days.

Whistler's bid for the two watershed protection and flood prevention structures involving some 28,516 cubic yards of earth fill and waterway work was \$16,791.49.

Second low bid of \$16,976.89 was offered jointly by Robert McConnell and Henry Burger of Bloomfield. McConnell and Burger were low bidders on a contract awarded last fall and are currently working on the Aura Barnett farm southwest of Bloomfield.

Four other bids were submitted.

One of the proposed structures on the O. J. Scott farm

will have a 5.85-acre pond. The structure on the Dean Grim farm will have a 6.2-acre pond.

The structural waterway work will be on the former Alva Davis farm recently purchased by Lee Shelton of Des Moines. All sites are approximately six miles southwest of Bloomfield.

Sam Botts Jr., commissioner of Davis County Soil Conservation District, is contacting officer for the project and presided at the bid opening.
