TEACHERS FOR DISTRICT NO. 2 SCHOOL (DUNN)

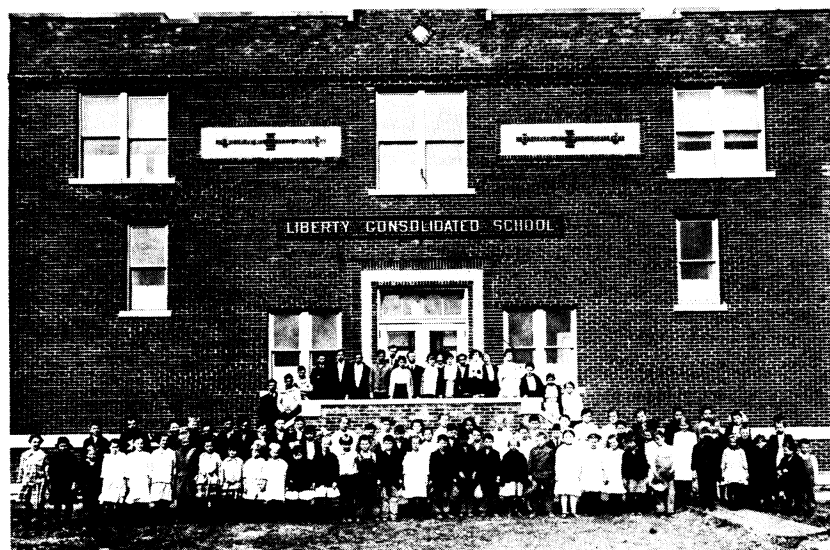
On July 21, 1874, the first meeting of the board of directors of the Independent District of Dunn, Liberty Township, No. 2, met for the purpose of levying a tax for the ensuing year. They moved a tax of \$75 for the contingent fund and \$200 for the teacher's fund. There was no other business.

D. D. Rockhill was president and H. J. Howard, secretary.

Following is a listing of teachers and the period each taught. The date indicated is the date the term began, followed by the name of the teacher and the number of weeks in each term. (Excerpt from book containing minutes of school board meetings, teacher contracts and class lists)

LIBERTY CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL



Liberty Consolidated School, said to be the first exclusively rural consolidated school in Iowa, consisted of districts 1, 2, 5 and 6 of Liberty Township. Built in 1914, the school contained four general classrooms, an assembly hall, a library and a classroom for science and agriculture. In 1926, the Dunn Settlement Church, which was no longer in use, was moved northwest of the school building and remodeled as a gymnasium.

The school was built to answer needs of the community as a social center as well as provide for teaching of more advanced subjects, such as agriculture and domestic science. The high school graduated 137 students before it was discontinued in 1947. The school closed in 1953.

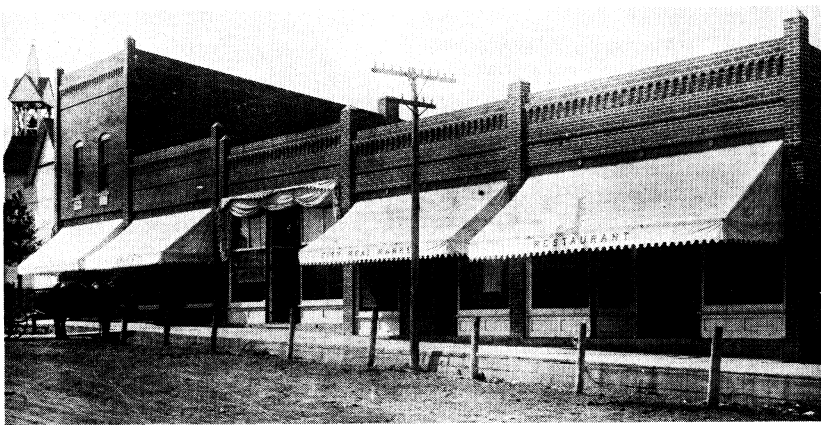

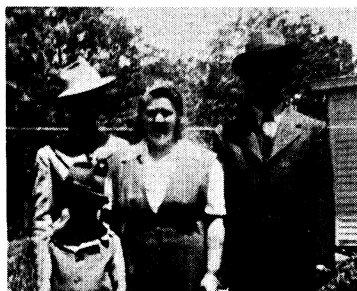
