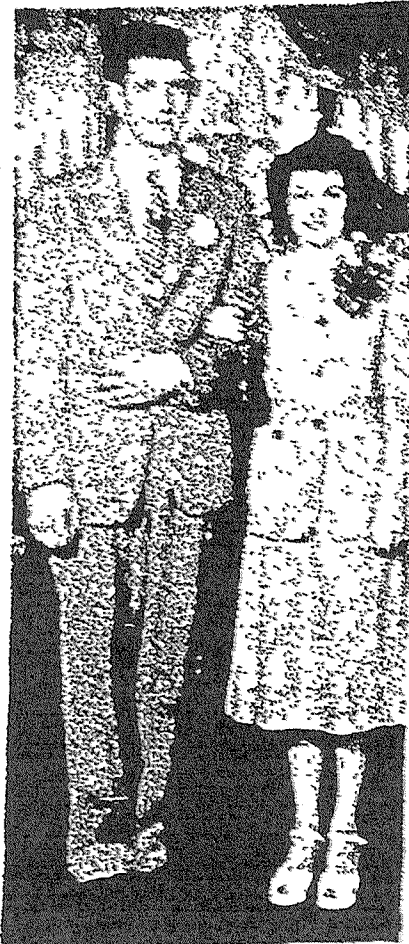
Dale Hilleman and Howard Hilleman were ushers.
