NO-TILL DRILL AVAILABLE TO FARMERS

The seeder was used to seed grasses and legumes, soybeans, wheat, and warm season native grasses. The seeder is designed to seed into an existing sod or in heavy residues. This ability offers many opportunities to improve or completely renovate steep pastures and haylands while conserving soil.
