Watershed Site For Field Days

The 1968 Conservation Field Days and contour plowing matches have been set for Sept. 5 and 6, at a site of 400 to 500 acres, selected just east of Eldora which involves farms of Delmar Swasand, Ed Wiesner, Ray McDowell, Richard "Red" Crosser and Boyd Reece.

Paul Primus of Steamboat Rock, who is serving as chairman of the Hardin County Co-ordinating Committee, said, "the September 5 and 6 Field Day dates should attract one of the largest out-of-county attendances in history." Chairman Primus

is working with a Hardin County Co-ordinating Committee as well as a State steering committee composed of Keith Kirkpatrick of WHO Radio-TV, Des Moines; Frank Mendell of Des Moines, State Conservationist with the Soil Conservation Service; Charles Ballintine of Ames, Extension Soil Conservationist with the Iowa State University Extension Service; and Wm. Granner of Des Moines, a Director with the State Soil Conservation Committee.

Hardin County has outstanding conservation practices underway

which recently attracted some 300 National Conservation members from all over the United States to view the work that is being done in this county. The Hardin County Technical Action Panel is composed of Chairman James Rector of Iowa Falls, Director of the Farmers Home Administration; Chuck McCarty of Eldora, Work Unit Conservationist with the Soil Conservation Service; James Goode of Eldora, Hardin Extension Service Director; and Gaylord Thayer of Iowa Falls, Office Manager for the Hardin County ASCS.
