# Should order *2-3-70* trees, shrubs

Land owners planning to plant trees and shrubs for conservation purposes should order their planting stock now, says Verle Arnold of the Soil Conservation Service Office in Bloomfield.

Arnold said the following planting stock is available from the State Conservation Commission Nursery at Ames.

Evergreens — including Norway Spruce, Austrian, Jack White, Red and Scotch pine available. The price is \$6.25 for 250 or \$25.00 per 1000.

Hardwoods available include Green Ash, Red Oak, White Oak, Dogwood and Honeysuckle. These cost \$5.00 for 250 or \$20.

per 1000.

One year old black walnut seedlings at a cost of \$6.25 for 250 or \$25.00 for 1000 are also available. There is a maximum limit of 150 walnut seedlings per landowner.

Each order must total at least 500 plants.

A special wildlife packet containing an assortment of 250 plants beneficial to wildlife is also offered for \$5.00. These can be used for plantings above farm ponds or for odd area planting.

State nursery stock cannot be used for windbreaks, shade or ornamental planting. They must be used for erosion control, wildlife or forestry purposes.

March 15 is the deadline for ordering the stock, said Arnold. Persons wanting ACP cost-sharing assistance on the tree planting practice, should apply at the Davis County ASCS Office prior to ordering the trees.
