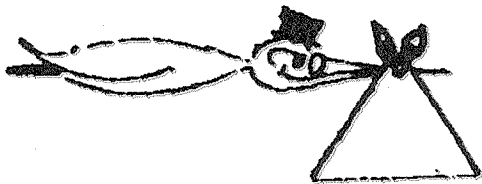

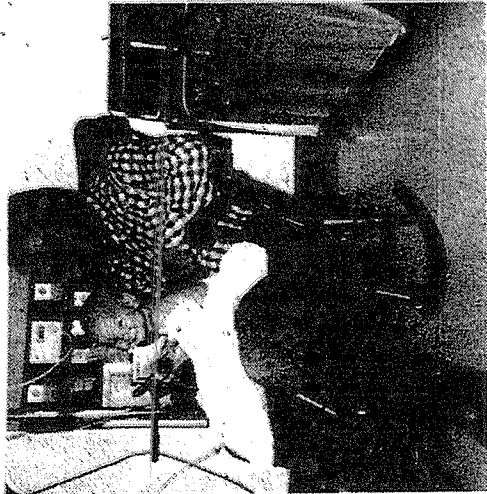
Heath was born September 25 at Mary Greely Hospital in Ames.

Jaycee benefit scheduled for young Heath Hilleman

State Center — A Jaycee-sponsored hog roast and casino night will be held on Saturday, November 6, at Lincoln Valley Clubhouse with the benefits to be donated to Heath Hilleman, 12-month old son of Barb and Tom Hilleman, who is undergoing treatment for a rare medical disorder.

The dinner is slated to begin at 6:30 p.m. and the casino night will start at 8 p.m.

Heath Hilleman, at 12 and one-half months, has spent more than half of his life traveling in and out of hospitals as medical authorities battle with him a rare disorder that holds his young life at constant danger.

The disorder is a chronic secretory diarrhea which means that Heath's body system lacks the mechanism to absorb nutrients and to break down sugar. Thus, he is unable to eat in a normal manner, and has, for many months now, been fed through mechanical means of intravenous feeding and tubes in- at the end of the evening.

The tubal feedings were probably to come to an end also, Barb said last Monday as she was getting ready to leave for Rochester to travel once again with Heath up there in hopes that the authorities could do more for the young patient.

She said the tubal feeding has caused more diarrhea and noted that "it looks like they might have to find something else for him."

So far the disorder has the doctors baffled as nothing has worked really well for Heath, who is, however, a rather cheerful and usually content little fellow, according to his mother. This time the infant got to stay home for five days before this trip became evident.

Barb said she expects him to have another lengthy stay with tests and examinations to determine what else could be done for him.

Barb also explained that as Heath's mother she always felt things weren't right with him, from the day he was born, but it wasn't until he was four months old and stopped growing that the worrying started in earnest. Today Heath weighs just 13½ pounds and Barb noted that no one is really able to confirm any statements about a prognosis for the infant.

The Hillemans live on a farm three miles south of State Center, and Heath has one brother, Bryan, three years old.

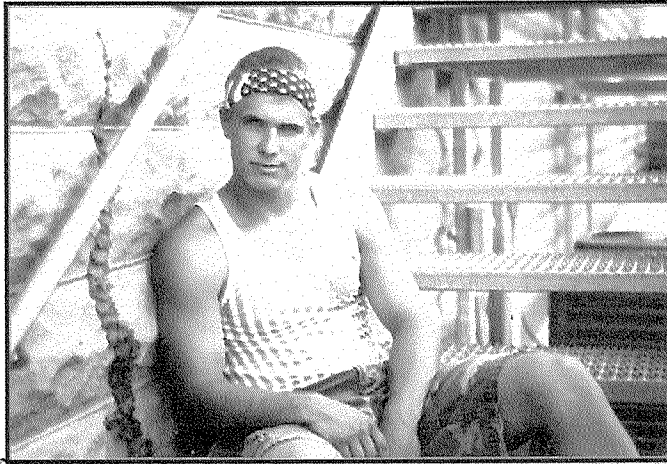

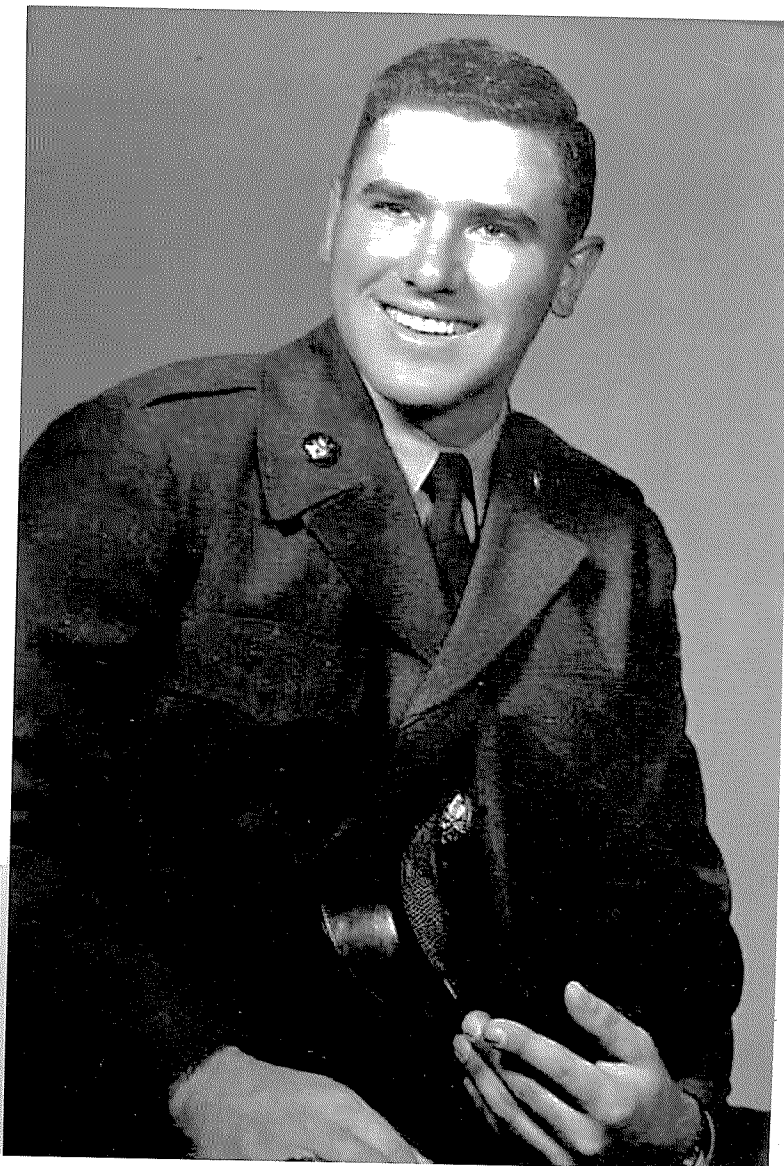
