HIGHLIGHTS OF DISTRICT ACTIVITIES

OCTOBER 1988 - SEPTEMBER 1989

OCTOBER - 1988

Muff gave a slide presentation for the Outstanding Conservation Farmer's Operation at the Annual Farm Bureau Meeting. Mike Cunningham was the recipient.

The Forestry Field Day was held at Osborn Conservation Center in Clayton County. The Water Resources Planning Staff from the State Office toured the Glovers Creek Watershed.

NOVEMBER - 1988

The Water Resources Planning Staff from the State Office toured the Glovers Creek Watershed.

DECEMBER - 1988

The Fayette County Conservation Association met to plan its Annual Meeting and Economic Yield Contest.

JANUARY - 1989

The Fayette County Conservation Association held its Annual Meeting. Approximately 80 people attended. Featured speakers were experienced ridge tiller, Dan Stadtmueller, and ISU Extension Ag Engineer, Stuart Melven, who spoke on field compaction.

FEBRUARY - 1989

The CRP sign-up was held February 6-24, 1989, with 29 bids submitted on 1,085 acres. The Fayette SWCD's Annual Report was published.

The Fayette SWCD held a Conservation Fair. Speakers from all local conservation agencies and Pheasants Forever gave presentations to explain what their agencies or groups had available to the public. Approximately 40 people attended.

MARCH - 1989

Muff and the SWCD Commissioners attended the Spring Regional meeting.

MAY - 1989

Muff met with SWCD Director, James Gulliford, and the SCS Assistant State Conservationist, Lyle Asell, to discuss the Glovers Creek Water Protection Fund and the Special Water Quality Project.

JUNE - 1989

A Glover Creek Watershed meeting for owners and operations was held. Approximately 20-25 landowners attended.

The Fayette County Conservation Association held its annual field day at the Gilbertson County Farm. The SWCD provided the lunch sponsored by several chemical companies.

JULY - 1989

The Fayette County Conservation Association sponsored a bus tour to two ridge-till farms near Monticello.

CRP eligibility determinations were done. A total of 53 bids were submitted.

SEPTEMBER - 1989

Muff attended the SWCD Fall Regional meeting in Clermont. Commissioner, William Bennett, gave a short presentation on the Glovers Creek Water Protection Fund.
