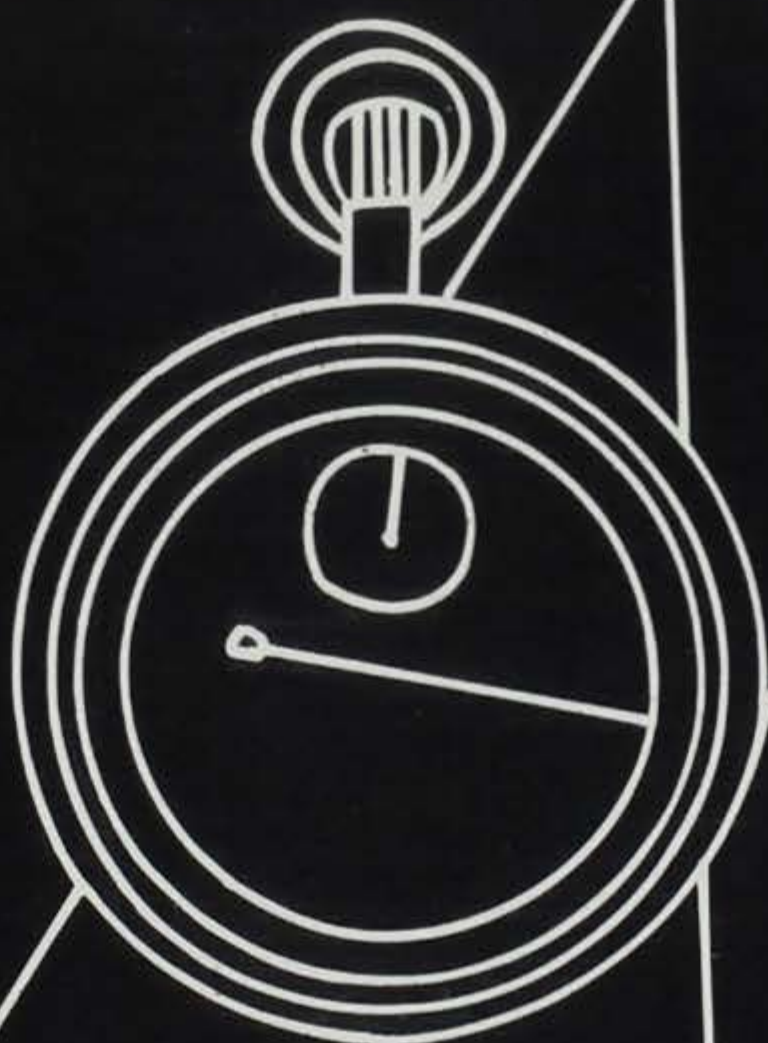
The Riviera is near Marseilles, so Lucy has spent many vacations at its beaches. Last winter, she vacationed in the Swiss Alps at a student hotel.

She definitely isn't homesick, but does miss seeing her family. She will stay in Ankeny until June, and then all the A.F.S. students will tour the United States before their return home.

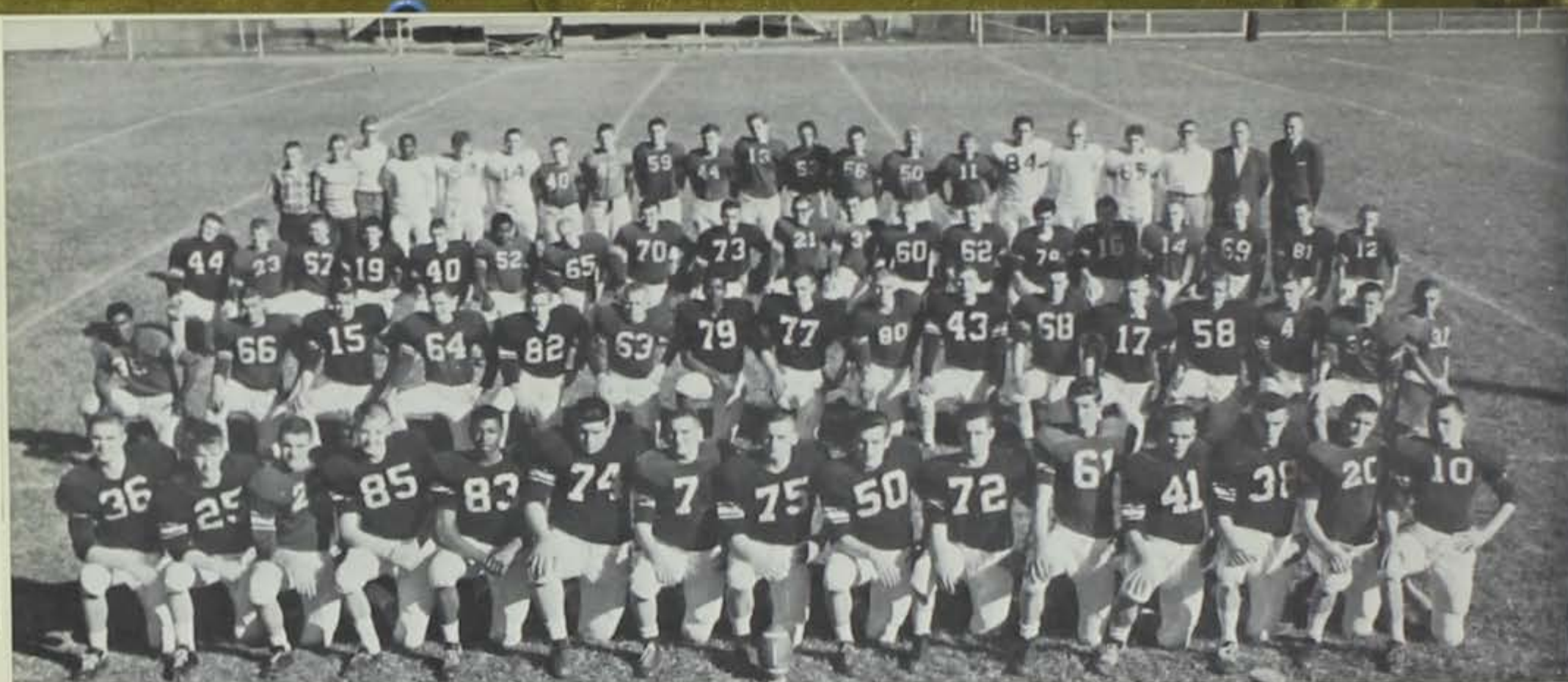
