

Dean Kelsey Is Honored By Soil Conservation Men

Receives 2nd Place Award In Outstanding Commissioner Contest

Dean Kelsey, Iowa Falls chairman of Hardin Soil Conservation District, was selected for the second place award in the outstanding Commissioner Contest at the regional meeting of Soil Conservation District Commissioners last week in Nevada.

Kelsey, who owns and operates a 240-acre farm southeast of Iowa Falls, represented the Hardin District in the contest. District chairman since 1957, he has been active in conservation work as has his father C. J. Kelsey, since the organization of the district.

Some of the earliest terraces constructed in the county were constructed on the Kelsey Farm. In addition several field trials of grass mixtures and varieties have been established.

In 1958, 7,000 Austrian, Red and White Pines were planted in a seven acre area with a border planting of Multiflora Roses.
