

Conservation Needs Study Meeting Held

A study of soil and water conservation needs of Hardin county was conducted at a meeting held in the county extension office conference room Wednesday, March 11, according to Cal Moore, chairman of the committee.

THE COMMITTEE, composed of representatives of local agricultural agencies and farm organizations considered land use today as compared to expected changes in 1975. Problems of watershed projects and conservation practices were discussed.

The study is a part of a national effort being conducted by the U. S. Department of Agriculture. The project will compile a needs inventory for every county in the nation by 1960. The data will enable better planning of programs needed to improve the soil and water resources.
