

Soil Commissioner to Be Elected Here Mon.

Land owners, farmers and tenants in the Hardin Soil Conservation District will elect a Soil Commissioner Monday, June 7.

The election will be held in the Janssen Implement building across from the Post Office in Eldora. Polls will be open from 6 to 9 p.m.

Candidates for the position of Soil Commissioner are Dale Petty of Eldora and Kermit Whitehead of New Providence. The contest is a re-run of the March 22 election when the two candidates received 37 votes each for Commissioner.

Petty is presently serving as a Commissioner, appointed to that post in 1964. Prior to that, in 1962, he was appointed as an assistant Commissioner. Petty, who became a soil conservation co-

operator in 1946, owns 140 acres in Eldora township and farms an additional 330 acres.

Whitehead became a cooperator with the Hardin Soil Conservation District in January, 1949. He owns and farms 260 acres in Providence township. The New Providence area farmer has served the Hardin Conservation District as an assistant Commissioner since April, 1964.

Other Hardin Soil Conservation District Commissioners are Paul Primus of Steamboat Rock and Dean Kelsey, chairman, of Iowa Falls. Ted Cutler of New Providence is an assistant Commissioner.

All land owners, farmers and tenants in the Hardin Soil Conservation District are eligible to vote in the election.
