S U M M A R Y

The District completed 40 new basic farm plans bringing the total to 238 Kossuth farms operated with a soil conservation plan. There are 100 additional plans in the process of completion.

The S. C. S. technical personnel certified Agricultural Conservation Program projects eligible for A. C. P. payments to the extent of 272,693 feet of tile drains, 634 acres of farm drainage and 16,061 cu. yds. of open drains.

The District held an annual meeting open to the public with R. K. Bliss of S. C. S. as the speaker. It participated with a float decorated by the Rev. O. L. Nelson at the Algona Centennial. Delegates of the District and members of the technical staff attended Regional Conferences, Public School and P. T. A. meetings.

The club of District cooperators organized formally and elected to office Walter Campney as President, Joseph Skow, Vice-president, and Glenn Jenkinson, Secretary-treasurer.

FOREWORD

To the farmers and all who are interested in the land of Kossuth County:

"To farm each acre of land in accordance with its capability" is the Soil Conservationist goal because it is good for the farmer, it is good for the land and it is vital to the interest of our nation.

Now the practical application of this ideal to the varying situation in farming differs widely because of the differences in the soils, climates, crops and management. The use of grass and legumes in crop rotations, however, is one soil improving and soil conserving practice which is common to almost all farming areas. Since, in Kossuth County, "Corn" is the one grain crop most likely to produce the highest return over the years, we thought it pertinent to quote here a statement * made in 1954 by Iowa State College Agricultural Economists:

"—most Iowa farms produce two or more crops. And corn yields are increased by producing some legume forage along with corn in rotation. Up to a point, increasing legume acreage increases total crop production. **Per acre corn yields are increased because of added nitrogen and other indirect effects from legumes.** These yield increases more than offset the "reduction" from taking acreage out of corn."

"Until the point is reached where increased yield per acre no longer compensates for the corn acreage withdrawn, it **pays to raise the two crops (corn and legumes) together — even if the forage has no other value than as a green manure crop.**"

Your commissioners agree fully with this statement and your Soil Conservation District and its U. S. Soil Conservation Service technical personnel are here for the primary purpose to assist the farmers of Kossuth County to attain the goal of farming our land in the best interest of the farmer, the soil and our county.

The ASC, through the ACP program, is authorized to make payments on various practices that are carried out on the individual farms. However, the permanent type practices, must be certified by the Soil Conservation Technicians before the farmer is eligible for his ACP payment.

Our records show a total of 3,625 farms. The farmland is 616,-163 acres and 551,414 acres of cropland.

To the Families of Kossuth County:

It is our privilege to present a brief report of the Soil and Conservation activities of the Kossuth Extension Service during the past year. Our records indicate that the Extension Director devoted 18.1% of all field time to soils work and the C. E. Y. A. 3% of his time. This only includes actual time reported as definitely used in this area. It includes 1560 persons contacted at meetings, etc., by the C. E. D. and 90 by the C. E. Y. A. The C. E. D. also serves as secretary of the Kossuth Soil Conservation District

Extension educational activities in the soils field includes proper land use, terracing, drainage, irrigation, land clearing, soil improvement crops, soil testing recommendations, crops grown for grain, hay, forage, pasture, etc. It also includes plant disease, insect control and work of that nature.

But productivity per individual, rather than time expended is the real basis of measuring farm progress. And the steadily climbing productivity of Kossuth County farmers is proof of that achievement. With the continuing splendid cooperation of the other agencies, organizations and agricultural leadership in Kossuth your Extension Service pledges its efforts toward even better land use educational motivation programs in the future.

Conservation Commission Report on Schools

The public schools of Kossuth County have had access to the handbook on the Teaching of Conservation, Vol. XIV since 1948. This current year has seen the consolidation of pupils into the town centers leaving no one-room rural schools. This change in organization has left some gaps in the close supervision of courses of study because of the greatly enlarged areas which our office now serves. Through training courses and teacher contacts with local resources we hope to build this service to include a more extended program. The offering of a science course by our Iowa State Teachers College this Winter Quarter is a renewal of efforts in that direction. Local personnel from the conservation commission are again being asked for their assistance in this project. Several new science series of elementary textbooks are giving greater emphasis to the conservation program in these grades which indicates the degree to which the topic is gaining importance. Our office wishes to express its appreciation for the interest and cooperative assistance which the Conservation Commission has given in the county schools during the past year. Suggestions are always welcome.
