Prominent Retired Farmer of Melbourne Community Dies

Melbourne — (Special) — Martin Damman, a prominent retired farmer of this community, died at his home Tuesday afternoon at 3 o'clock. He had been in failing health since last fall and bedfast for a week. Death was caused by cancer of the stomach.



Mr. Damman was born at Freeport, Ill., May 16, 1869, the son of Frederick and Martin Damman Friedericka Damman, and came to Iowa with his parents when a small boy, spending his boyhood on a farm near Newton.

He was baptized July 4, 1869, and confirmed April 6, 1884, in St. John's Evangelical church near Newton.

After his marriage to Matilda Tinnermeier of Newton on Oct. 5, 1892, they lived for many years on a farm south of Melbourne, moving to town in 1928. They observed their golden wedding anniversary in 1942.

Besides his widow he is survived by four sons, Albert, Clarence, Walter and Joe; two daughters, Mrs. Louis Herzog and Mrs. Lewis Preston, all near Melbourne; three brothers, August, Laurel; Henry, Newton, and Fred, Baxter, and one sister, Mrs. Emma Eib of Laurel.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon at St. John's Evangelical and Reformed church in charge of Rev. Reuben Grosshuesch, preceded by a prayer service at 1:30 at the home. Burial will be in the Melbourne cemetery.

Woman Found Dead In Home

Melbourne — (Special) — Mrs. Matilda Damman was found dead at her home about 8:30 a. m. Monday by a neighbor who investigated when she was not seen about as usual. She had been in her usual health and had attended church Sunday morning but evidently died shortly after returning home. *G-Gene said she still had 1 glove on*

Dr. Harold Sauer, coroner, was called and said death was of natural causes.

The body was taken to the Ryan funeral home in Melbourne.
