

Parallel terraces were checked on the Gerald Modlin farm and on the Lee Lundy farm operated by Marlyn Eilers, both east of Eldora. Over a mile of terraces have been constructed on the Modlin farm and nearly 2½ miles have been built on the Lundy farm this year. In addition, newly constructed grassed waterways were observed on the farms and also on the Edward Eekhoff farm near Eldora.

A drainage project involving over 5000 feet of 12, 10, 8 and 6 inch tile was seen on the Dolly Dale farm operated by George Elliott, Iowa Falls.

On the Allan Mortenson and Edward Bossard farms north of Radcliffe, a proposed open drainage ditch project was observed. The ditch will drain over 3000 acres of land from both Hamilton and Hardin counties.

Tree planting was seen on the Art Nehring and on the Fred and Carroll Groen farms, both north of Hubbard. 6000 red, white and Austrian pines have been planted on the Nehring farm within the last 4 years. 2500 pines were planted on the Groen farm in 1958.
