HIGHLIGHTS OF DISTRICT'S ACTIVITIES

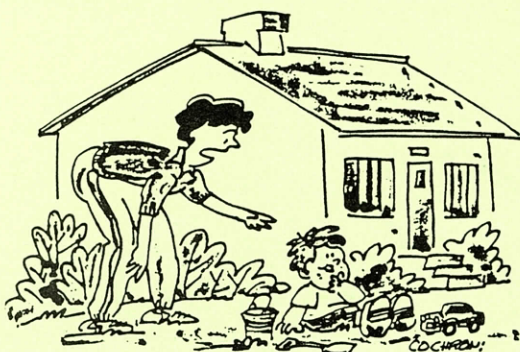
The Annual Awards Banquet was held on March 13, 1987 and honored area people for their work in soil conservation in 1986.

"Conservation's New Frontiers" was the theme for Soil and Water Stewardship Week, which was observed May 4-11, 1986. The district furnished booklets to all 162 churches in Black Hawk County.

The Friends of Conservation Award was presented to the Farm Bureau Women's Club for their help and dedication in distributing the Iowa Soil 2000 folders to all landowners and operators in 8 townships.

Quinter Lichty of Orange Township was presented the Izaak Walton League Windbreak Award in 1986. Lichty's windbreak consists of 2 rows of Arborvitae and one row of Honeysuckle. This well managed windbreak will protect their farmstead for many years.

In the November General Election, Marvin Haugebak from Waterloo Township and L. Jeanette Winegarden from Cedar Falls Township, were elected as Commissioners to fill the positions vacated by Vincent Delagardelle and Wm. Greg Strayer who chose not to run again. They did, however, accept the appointment of Assistant Commissioners.

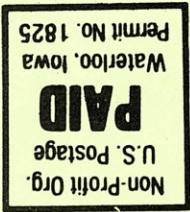
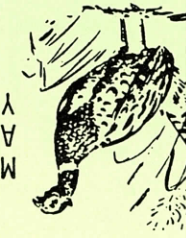
