

NOTES TAKEN FROM PRISONER OF WAR POCKET NOTE BOOK.

Apr 9, 1942, BATAAN fell By boat to Corregidor. 0400

On Corregidor some were in a dug out. shelling
A soldier came along crawling and wanted
volunteer's for to go to Fort Hughes.
I poked that guy next too me and said thats us.

Apr. 10, 2000 Fort Hughes and was assigned to Search light #
11. facing the sea.

May 6, 1942 Corregidor fell White rag.

May 7, 1942 0600 Jap Landing force on Hughes.

May 11, 1942 Corregidor by tug # 4679

Sent to 92nd area on beach with other
prisoner of war.

May 23 Aboard Ship.

May 24th Landed POW's at end of Dewey Blvd. Manila.
Sunday. Marched to Bilibid prison. #10 27 section 7
Rice and onion soup. *Dressed arm + head*

May 28 0400 Left by train for Canbanatuan
1230 Arrived Canbanatuan 14 group

May 29 0500 Hiked 22 miles to 92st F.A. Camp.

Japanese said they wanted 340 man detail.

was marched to Jap headquarters. - left in truck

to Canbanatuan. 3:35 left. 0200 July 25,
Arrived Manila. Then to Bilibid Prison.

Stood by to leave by truck - ask for 15 drivers
and 100 men for working party.
Laid around Bilibid all day till 4 o'clock.

Aug 12 / 1942 Major of Japanese Army came down from Manila by Plane. He spoke perfect English.

I was out of commission really worked over.
& sores and ulcers all over my body.

He asked about Chow.
I would not be asked to work in field at this time.
If I could do typing and rosters list and help Interpreter. He told me that the guard said he did not receive a salute.

He told us that anybody that got sick and was not able to work in field would be sent back to Manila. And this Air Field was going to be built over our dead bodies.

Dec 23 Big day for me. Was ordered over to the big House (The house where the Japanese Captain lived near our compound) I, the Interpreter, and him typed up his speech that he was going to give at the Pental colony in the after noon. No American has ever been in the house before.
I was given a bowl of rice, a new shirt and trousers. The three of us then went to the Pental Colony, he gave his speech (about no working on the hollidays) and then we came home. When we got back to the house, I was asked to return the clothes - so back to my G-string.
