Mrs. Amelia Buschbom, 81, a well known local resident, passed away, Saturday morning, April 8th at Culver City, Calif., while visiting her daughter, Mrs. Herman Heuser. Mrs. Buschbom went to California early in January and had been hospitalized intermittently while there. She had been in failing health for the past nine months.

Funeral services were held Tuesday morning at ten - thirty o'clock at Trinity Lutheran Church with the Rev. E. A. Wiedbush officiating. The Wensel-Perrin Funeral Home was in charge. Interment was in Hillside cemetery.

Mrs. Buschbom was born September 5, 1885 in Marshall county, the daughter of Gustav and Dorothea Ahrens Rittlerodt. She was educated in St. John's Parochial School.

She was united in marriage to Robert Buschbom July 26, 1907 at State Center and they farmed 7 miles northwest of town until retiring in 1938 and moving to State Center.

ROBERT BUSCHBOM, WELLKNOWN RESIDENT SUCCUMBS SUNDAY

Robert Buschbom, 74, prominent retired farmer of State Center and a resident of Marshall county for over 67 years, passed away at his home here Sunday morning about seven o'clock. Mr. Buschbom had been in declining health for a long time and his death was caused from leukemia.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at St. Paul's Lutheran Church at two o'clock in charge of the Rev. Karl J. Baumgart, pastor of the Trinity Lutheran Church, preceded by prayer services at the home at one-thirty o'clock. Interment was in Hillside Cemetery.

Pallbearers were Fred Eggers, August Gerke, Henry Hunzelman, August Eggers, Fred Honeck and Fred Hannusch. Flower bearers were Gertrude Kimpston, Orpha Honeck, Ester Verripps, Marian Schuler, Minnie Severidt, Katherine Lekin, Ella Schoppe and Laura Wilkening. Music was provided by Mrs. Bess Germann, organist, and Denny Swartz and Gene Rittlerodt.

Robert Buschbom was born January 23, 1872, at Kankakee, Ill., the son of Andrew and Georgia Nolte Buschbom. When he was five years old he came to Marshall county with his parents, who settled in Minerva township. He spent his early life in that vicinity and for 42 years operated the farm known as "Sunnyside Farm." In 1940 he retired and with his wife moved to State Center.

He was married to Miss Rocelia Hartwig, February 17, 1898, and she passed away November 4, 1901. He was united in marriage to Miss Amelia Rittlerodt on July 26, 1907.

Mr. Buschbom was a life long member of St. John's Lutheran Church until the organization of the Trinity Lutheran Church a year ago, of which he became a member.

In addition to his widow, he is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Herman L. Heuser of St. Louis, Mo.; one son, Harold Buschbom, of State Center; his step-mother, Mrs. Augusta Buschbom, Marshalltown; three brothers, Oscar and Henry, State Center, and Herman of Lathrop Mo.; a half-brother, Ernie Buschbom, Marshalltown; one sister, Mrs. Lena Buschbom, State Center; a half-sister, Mrs. Melinda Bailey, Marshalltown. He also is survived by three grandchildren and one great-grandchild.
