

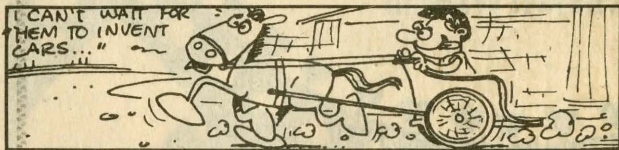
Hay probe available locally

The District Commissioners have purchased a HAY PROBE for any livestock or forage producers in the county. Cows should be entering their third trimester of pregnancy at this time and energy requirements will increase the closer she gets to calving. The only way to know if your forage has sufficient protein and total digestive nutrients is to have it tested.

Samples taken thus far this year have shown that "93" was not a good year for high quality

forage. Keep in mind that the condition of your cows now, has a great influence on your "95" calf crop.

The probe can be picked up at the Louisa County Soil Conservation Office. A small deposit is required. Iowa State University, through the Louisa County Extension Office will run the test or you may have your own feed company analyze it for you. If you have any questions call us at 523-6411.
