News Man Will Speak at Banquet

Bob Nance, farm director of WMT radio and television in Cedar Rapids, will be the guest speaker at the 23rd annual Davis County Soil Conservation District Cooperators banquet Tuesday.

The banquet will be held at 7 p.m. at the Bloomfield Methodist Church. Tickets may be purchased from the soil commissioners and at the local Soil Conservation office. Reservations must be made by noon Monday.

Nance, a native of Oklahoma, has been with WMT since 1952 and became farm director at the station in 1955. He is active in promotion of farm safety; presently serving as president of the National Corn Picking Contest Association and is vice president of the National Association of Farm Broadcasters.

The election of a district commissioner will be held Tuesday in conjunction with the meeting. Harold Baughman,

present commissioner, Charles Chickering and Kendall Johnson are seeking the six-year term as commissioner. The polls will be open from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Methodist Church with all land owners and farm operators in Davis County eligible to vote.

Voters may cast absentee ballots at the County Auditor's office prior to the election. The results will be announced at the close of the program.

Master of ceremonies at the banquet will be Commissioner Iles Heady. Baughman will introduce the guests.

Sam Botts Jr., commissioner, will present certificates for conservation achievements to three local farmers.
