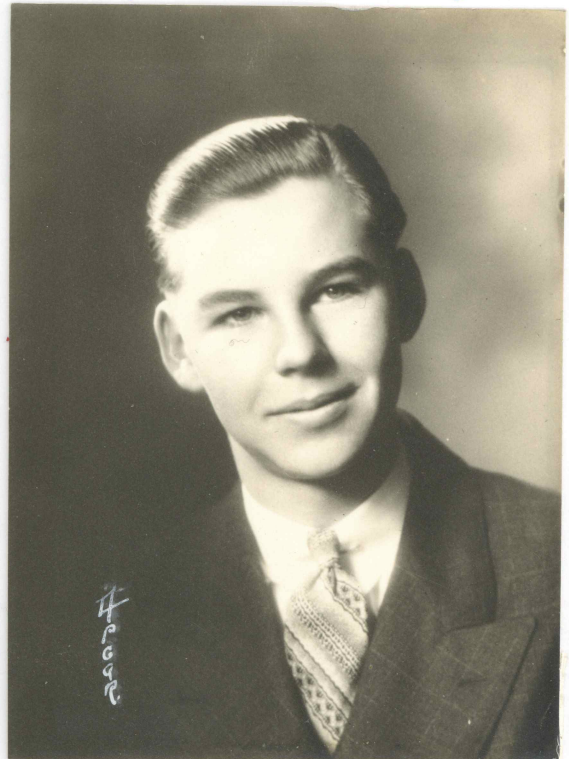
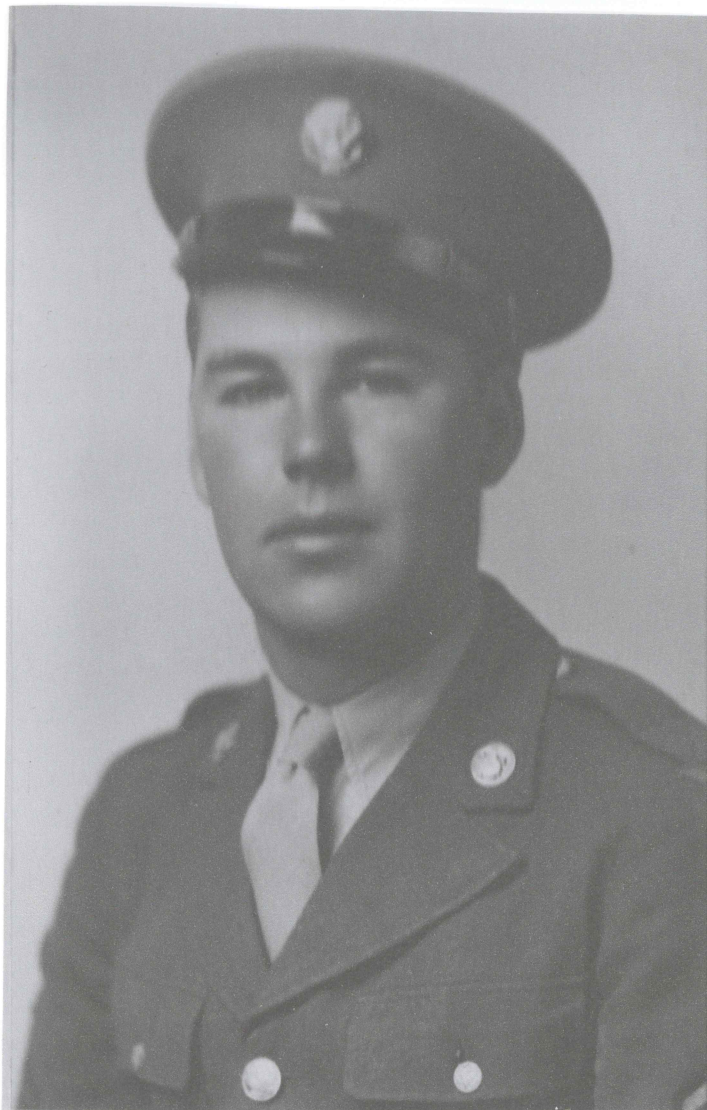

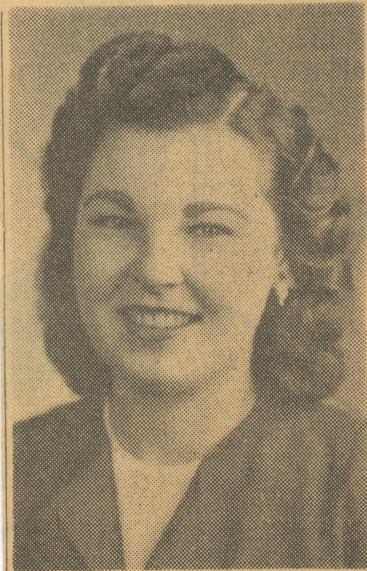

MELBOURNE — Services will be Monday at 1:30 p.m. at St. John United Church of Christ for Louis Herzog, 78, a long time resident of this community. Mr. Herzog died at 4:15 p.m. Friday at Skiff Memorial Hospital in Newton.

HE WAS born Dec. 30, 1889, son of Fred and Mary Propp Herzog, on the Herzog homestead near here where he spent his entire life until retiring in 1956. He was married March 22, 1916, in Melbourne to Minnie Damman and she preceded him in death on July 15.

Surviving are three children, Virgil L. of Denver, Colo.; Floyd M. of Melbourne and Doris S. McCutcheon of Atlantic. There are four grandchildren.

ALSO SURVIVING are four brothers and two sisters, Henry and Arthur of Melbourne, Fred and Bruno and Mrs. Arthur (Clara) Tiggles of Marshalltown, and Mrs. Albert (Rose) Smith, State Center.

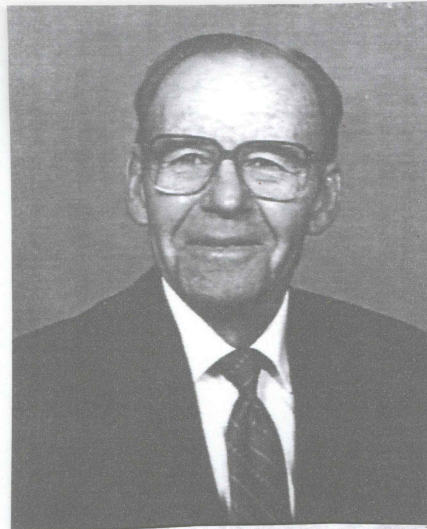

Floyd M. Herzog

February 27, 1920 - September 21, 2014

Floyd was born Feb. 27th, 1920 in Marshalltown, IA, the son of Louis and Minnie Herzog. He grew up on his family's farm south of Melbourne, and was baptized and confirmed at the Evangelical and Reform Church in Melbourne. He attended a country school until going to Van Cleave High School where he graduated in 1937. In Nov. 1936 Van Cleave asked the 1937 graduating class their vocation for the years to come, and Floyd's response was aviation. Floyd was active in his schools acting classes. In his junior class of 1935 he was cast in the play "Shirt Sleeves" as Elmer, Kitty's darling fiancé. In March of 1937 the class chose Floyd to play the Newspaper Photographer for their play "Tomboy". Upon graduating from Van Cleave, Floyd spent his time farming on the homestead until being called into the service. Stationed at Ft. Warren, WY, January 1942 to February 1942; Camp Normoyle, San Antonio, TX, February 1942 to May 1942; Ft. Meade, Md., May 1942, 76th QM Co., A.P. Hill Military Reservation, Fredericksburg, VA., 1943 Camp McCoy, WI., 1943; Camp Pori, MI, 1944 for winter training. Sailed from Boston, MA., Dec. 10, 1944 on the SS RICHARDSON. Attended QM Motor Transport School, Camp Normoyle, TX., Feb 10, 1942, subject 12 weeks motorcycle course in 1942. Thirty Second Gas Noncommissioned Officers Course, Edgewood Arsenal, MD., in 1944. Participated in battles at Ardennes, Rhineland, and Central Europe. Discharged Nov. 4th, 1945 from Camp Grant, IL. Achieved rank of sergeant, section leader 356. Was awarded the Good Conduct Medal, American Theatre Ribbon, European African Middle Eastern with three Bronze Metal Stars, Victory Medal, one Service Stripe, and one Overseas Service Bar. Upon his honorable discharge from the service, Floyd returned to his home and farmed with his father. He continued to farm on the homestead that had been in his family for two generations until his retirement in 1982.

He is survived by his two nieces and two nephews: Mark McCutcheon and family (Aaron, Seth, Ashley) of Harlan IA., Patti and her husband Tom Knop of Denver CO., Terri and her husband Darrell Jones of Phoenix AZ., and Monte McCutcheon and his wife Dawn and family (Lauren, Danae, Stephen) of Portland OR., cousins: Lloyd Preston and wife Leona of Marshalltown IA., Beverly Heckman of Marshalltown IA., and Mary Lou Fleming of Zeoring IA. He was preceded in death by his parents, Louis and Minnie Herzog, his sister Doris McCutcheon and brother-in-law Robert, and his brother Virgil L. Herzog and sister-in-law Audiene. Floyd will be forever remembered by the surviving members of his family for all of the love he has shown them throughout the years.
