

Bids Being Solicited On Watershed Seeding

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Bids on the liming, fertilizing and seeding of the completed part of the Big Wyacondah Watershed structural work are being solicited, Clay C. Barnett, chairman of the Davis County Soil Conservation District, announced today.

Approximately 27 acres of seeding and 95 squares of jute netting is involved on the five structures and the three structural waterways.

Persons interested in bidding on the seeding work should contact the Davis County Soil Conservation District Office in Bloomfield.

Award Contract For Vegetative Watershed Work

A contract in the amount of \$3,603.40 for vegetative work on the completed part of the Big Wyacondah Watershed has been awarded to Bruce Harryman Jr. of Douds.

Clay Barnett, chairman of the Davis County Soil Conservation District, said that Harryman's bid of \$106 per acre on the 28.9 acres to be limed, fertilized and seeded was the lowest of five bids received. Also included in the contract is the furnishing and laying of 90 squares of jute mesh at \$6 per square.

The vegetative work will be done on the structures and structural waterways that have been built on the Frank Shively, Aura Barnett, Dale Dixon, Dean Grim, O. J. Scott and Lee Shelton farms.

Work on the contract started Monday and should be completed within 10 days.
