2. The History of the Passion and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

3. The Creed or Christian Faith in Bible Passages.

First Article.

a. I believe that it is God who made me and all creatures.

b. I believe that it is God, who still preserves me and all creatures.

e. I believe that I am in duty bound to thank and praise, serve and obey God for all that He has done and still does for me.

Second Article.

a. I believe that I can find salvation in Jesus Christ only.

b. I believe that my Lord and Savior is true God and true man.

d. I believe that Jesus Christ by sufferings and death and resurrection became my Lord and King, whose own I shall be now and forever.

Third Article.

a. I believe that by my own reason or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ.

b. I believe that only the Holy Spirit can impart to me saving faith.

c. I believe that the Holy Spirit works faith in me thru the word and sacrament.

e. I believe that even in baptism the Holy Spirit has forgiven me all my sins and made me a child of God.

f. I believe that I sin daily and therefore daily need to repent of my sins and believe in Jesus Christ in order that I may daily receive the forgiveness of my sins.

h. I believe that the Holy Spirit will after death impart to all believers eternal life.

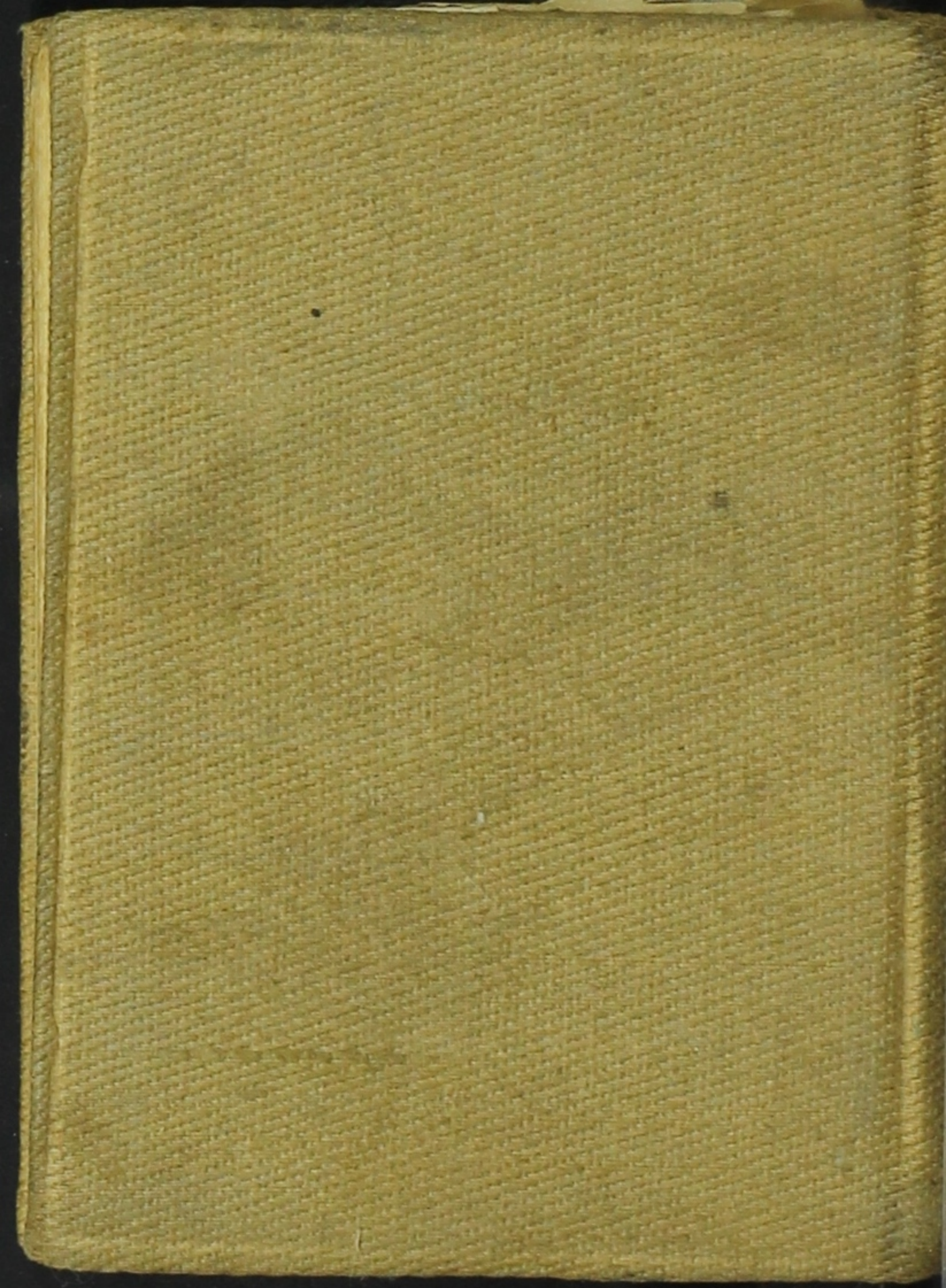
